Discovery from Distress

In a powerful and passionate message John, completing the story of Lazarus in yesterday's Palm Sunday sermon, developed the idea, shared last week that delay on the part of Jesus was not rejection but deliberate. There were lessons to be learned of more value than temporary comfort. It was more than a genuine offer of help to a grieving family.

Seeing their confusion and distress that this had happened because He wasn't there, Jesus shares their grief but assures them that He is the Resurrection and that in believing in Him there is power over death. That echoes Paul's assurance to the Colossians: Christ in you, the hope of glory.

Nor was it a dispassionate truth for He grieved over the sin of man that was the cause of such distress as He set His face towards Jerusalem to pay the ultimate price and gain the Victory. That is the confidence that can take us through the present crisis.

Low-level HighTech

Apart from the high tech development associated with Zoom and these other sophisticated devices, we've heard this week of three examples of a simple arrangement. Someone has placed their open phone next to their computer broadcast of the Sunday sermon which is then being listened to by someone else on their phone even though they have no internet access. Ingenious! It not only shows initiative but is evidence of real concern for each other. Perhaps the church should be offering grants towards heightened phone bills?!!

Finance

As the Church is still liable for all outgoings throughout this difficult period we would encourage members to continue their financial giving of tithes and offerings to the

Lord. For those who regularly give by monthly Standing Order no action is needed. However for those who give by envelope or through the offering bags the following suggestions may be helpful:

Monthly Standing Order - This is the preferred method which requires a simple form from your own bank to be completed. It only needs to be arranged once. For those who are self-isolating, a friend or neighbour may be willing to obtain and return the form from your bank.

BACS - For those who have internet access to their personal bank account, a BACS transfer could be made to the Church at any time. To assist the Treasurer to identify transfers for Gift Aid and Non Gift Aid purposes, transfers should be identified by the initial of the forename followed by the surname (eg D Jack).

Cash and cheques- For those who give weekly or monthly by cash or cheque it is recommended that this is now given only by a cheque which should be mailed to the Treasurer.
