'Music for Wind'



Full of drama and exuberance, an ensemble from Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra play extracts from Mozart's *Don Giovanni*, including the *Overture*, music full of the vitality and virility of the Don himself. The beauty of wind instruments and the virtuosity of the players is showcased with Octets by Gipsy and Beethoven, a charming quintet by Zemlinsky and Debussy's *Syrinx* exhibits the beauty of solo flute. Ibert's *Trois Pièces Brèves* interweaves flute and clarinet lines to a delicate effect; there is a freshness and elegance to the melodies throughout these three short pieces. Florence Price originally wrote *Adoration* for an organ church performance, but this arrangement sees the piece in new light performed by the wind players. Price's unique style is on display, as she weaves African American spiritual melodies with European classical tradition.

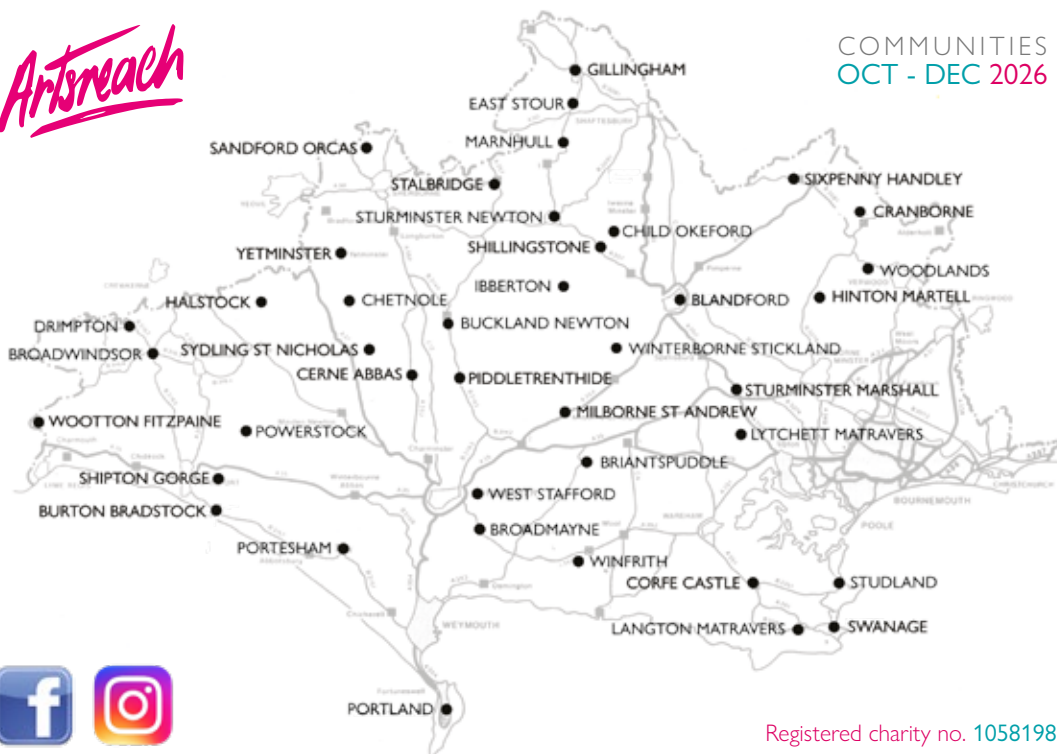
