


#### **BACKGROUND**

As a response to entries and enquiries from outside Great Britain, it added 'International' to the title in 2008. Its first exhibition took place at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, in May 2008 and quickly established itself as the world's premier garden and plant photography event.

International Garden Photographer of the Year is the world's premier competition and exhibition specialising in garden, plant, flower and botanical photography.

International Garden Photographer of the Year is wholly owned and organised by Garden World Images Ltd.

It is run in association with the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, United Kingdom. The main exhibition is held annually at Kew, with a rolling programme of touring exhibitions in the UK and all over the world. Exhibitions are linked to events such as workshops and lectures on garden photography.






#### THE COMPETITION

Each year, the competition opens in March and closes on October 31st.

Winners are announced in February. The following year's competition is launched at that point. The competition is open to everyone anywhere in the world. Images do not have to be taken in a specified year. There is no distinction drawn between professional and amateur photographers.



There are eleven main categories to enter and a special section for people under 17 years of age.

Current categories include:
The Beauty of Plants
Beautiful Gardens
Wildflower Landscapes
Wildlife in the Garden
Greening the City
Bountiful Earth
Breathing Spaces
Trees, Woods and Forests



Photographers can enter either single images or a set of six images in a portfolio.

In addition to the annual competition, there are three 'photo project' categories that run throughout the year, with results announced three times a year.

There is a fee for entering the competition which helps to cover the expense of mounting and touring the exhibition. In 2017, this fee is £12 for 4 single images, or £25 for a portfolio. Under 16s can enter for free.


