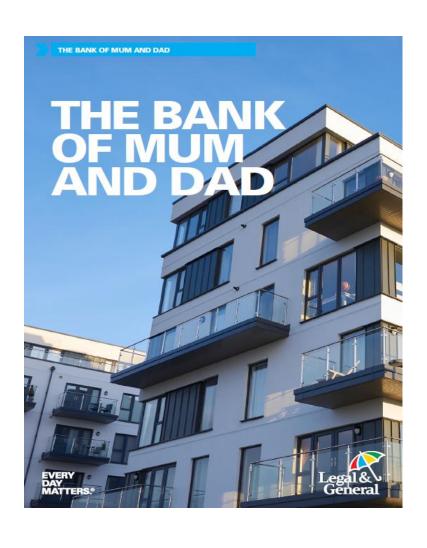

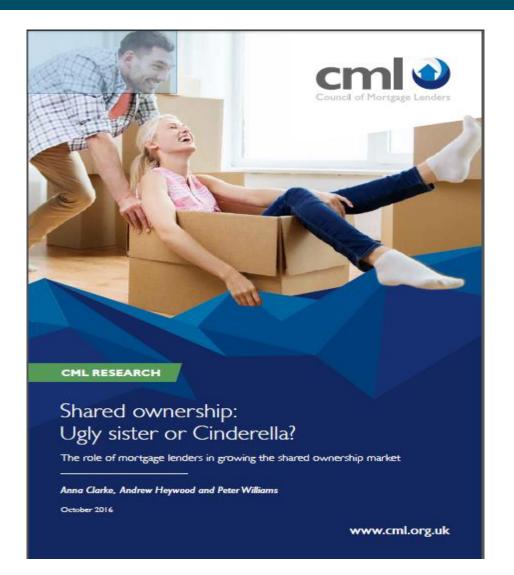

#### **Key Findings - Mortgage Lenders and Shared Ownership**

- Around 200,000 UK households currently live in Shared Ownership homes, which equates to 0.4% of housing stock in England and 1.3% of all mortgages currently held.
- Improved Shared Ownership eligibility set to increase demand, although competing with other First Time Buyer schemes (in particular Equity Loan and Starter Home).
- Mortgage lenders' support for the sector is essential as 75% of purchasers buy with a mortgage and 90% are First Time Buyers.

#### **Key Findings on Shared Ownership**

- Re-sales market has grown steadily in recent years, now 1/3 of all Shared Ownership sales.
- Reasonable number of lenders (c18) support Shared Ownership, which is relative to the market size, however majority are regional building societies.
- However, currently 3 / 4 lenders provide the majority of total lending.
- Existing lenders are relaxed about increasing Shared Ownership volumes
   BUT new entrants needed to meet Governments target of 135,000 by 2021.

#### **Opportunities and Challenges for Lenders**

- There is a shortage of products available for buyers with low deposits and restrictions with new build site exposure limits.
- Lenders are put off due to; other priorities, deemed higher risk lending, complexities and having to liaise with a Housing Association in the event of a default.
- The research did not find clear evidence of higher rates of arrears or repossessions with Shared Ownership borrowers (by comparison).
- Lack of knowledge within lenders regarding Shared Ownership, the language is very different (MPC / stair-casing etc).

#### **Opportunities and Challenges for Lenders**

- Lenders typically operate with scheme 'caps' for both new business and total lending book.
- Changes to eligibility, section 106 restrictions and the lease lenders require stability and consistency.
- Shared Ownership via Private Developers lenders are <u>VERY</u> cautious about lending to a less regulated and established sector.

#### **Lender Requirements:**

- Demand statistics / waiting list to establish the size of the opportunity?
- HA's to operate consistent / standardised approach re handling of rent arrears - sign up to protocols for good working practice - NHF / HCA guidance?
- Consider alternatives to the current section in the lease which allows Housing Associations to terminate the lease on grounds of rent arrears?
- Section 106 / Low Cost Discounted Market Value Schemes (DMS)
  - Standardise the re-sale restrictions?







#### WHAT MIGHT THE FUTURE HOLD?

- Improved relationships between Housing Associations and lenders
- Increased lender support for Shared Ownership:
  - o new purchases, re-mortgage, stair-casing and movers
- Improved lending policy with:
  - increased loan to value's (LTV's)
  - cases that don't fit the 'high street lenders' due to:
    - complex / non-standard income (self employed / contractors etc)
    - low credit score
    - minor / historic credit issues
