To make things worse the first attempt failed as I could not take the camera down my throat, so the whole costly exercise had to be repeated. The new procedure would have avoided all these complications and costs as it could have been done at the specialist hospital. - and probably much more quickly. I believe the Royal Free governors should push for the new procedure to be fully adopted as soon as possible.
