

# Double podium for Turner Motorsport at Road America!

The GT podium for the Grand Am (Rolex Series) championship race at Road America on August 10 was awash with the blue and yellow of Turner Motorsport. Supported technically by Motul, the team actually won the class and finished third. Paul Dalla Lana and Bill Auberlen's BMW secured GT pole position, remained at the forefront throughout the race and crossed the finish line with a lead of 4.2 seconds over the second-placed car, bringing the team its third win of the season!

Michael Marsal and Maxime Martin's BMW was third in qualifying but kept in touch with the leaders from the start. On the fifth lap they were hit by a Porsche, fortunately without untoward consequences, and in the second half of the race the BMW climbed back up the order to record its final, excellent third place. "This is my first podium," exclaimed Michael Marsal at the end of the event. "It was a great end after a bit of a hectic start where I was nearly pushed off the track." A bold strategy contributed towards the team's victory, as recounted by Marsal's boss, Don Salama: "We knew that a good strategy could help us win, and we chose to stop just once whereas many other teams had to carry out one more fuel stop. But I admit that it was very tight, and our

two cars ran out of fuel just after crossing the finish line!» The 11th round of the season was held the following weekend at the Kansas City circuit. Without being able to repeating its brilliant Road America performance, Turner Motorsport nevertheless claimed a solid seventh place, while finishing fifth in the Continental Tire Challenge. These results mean the team is holding 5th place in the GT championship standings with two rounds remaining, the next due to take place on September 7-8 at Laguna Seca.

# SERT dominates at Oschersleben and Penz13.com claims Superstock victory

Vincent Philippe, Anthony Delhalle and Julien Da Costa's Suzuki won the Eight Hours of Oschersleben on August 17 with a two-lap lead over the BMW of Team Thevent. Dominique Méliand, owner of the Suzuki Endurance Racing Team, can therefore smile again after the relative disappointment of fourth place for the Motul-supported team at Suzuka and the team has also widened its lead in the provisional standings. 'Our strength was to have a very homogenous team and very good tires,' noted Da Costa.

The weekend was also successful for several other Motul teams as the YART Yamaha, in the hands of Broc Parkes, Josh Waters and Igor Jerman, climbed onto the third step of the podium. The line-up was on track to claim second but a minor fire prevented that

although it didn't stop them from setting a new fastest race lap: 'It was pretty special to be able to set a new race lap record after a fire started at the final refuelling stop of the race,' acknowledged Broc Parkes. 'The bike was in pretty poor state.'

However, there was disappointment for the Honda TT Legends team as a fuelling issue saw them lose touch with the leading teams.

In Superstocks, there was also great success for a Motul Team. The Penz13.com BMW 1 1000 RR, ridden by Jason Pridmore, Pedro Vallcaneras and Steve Mercer, took a stunning victory at its home race. At first the race seemed to favour the LMS Suzuki Junior Team (also a Motul team), but a fall mid-way through the race changed things dramatically. The euphoria was

obviously riding high after this result, as witnessed by the reaction of Rico Penzkofer, Penz13.com's boss: 'I'm more than happy to have taken this home win! Thank you to all the members of our team, our riders, our chief mechanic and all those who crossed their fingers for us today.'

Third in Superstocks also went the way of a Motul team. Didier van Keymeulen, Raymond Schouten and Lucas Mahias's DG Sport Herock Yamaha R1 managed to wipe out bad memories of retirement from the Bol d'Or. 'This podium shows that we have reached the upper level,' said Olivier Aerts, head of the Belgian team.

All eyes will now turn to the last race of the season, the 24 Hours of Le Mans on 21 and 22 September. A second race of this length this season, it can be the setting for all kinds of twists and turns!



# Crutchlow remains the shining star of the privateer teams

The MotoGP race at Indianapolis on 18 August didn't disappoint the 60,000 spectators as the confrontations between the competitors carried on right to the bitter end. This race saw Marc Márquez record another victory after having dominated every session, and put himself into serious contention for the title. If he wins he will be the first « rookie » to do so since Kenny Roberts but there are still eight races remaining so there's still all to play for.

For Team Tech3, Cal Crutchlow's fifth place was a great performance given the opposition that he faced and he remains at the head of the privateer team riders. He fought throughout the race with Alvaro Bautista from whom he managed to snatch fifth place, but was unable to hold back Valentino Rossi who closed in on the leaders in the second half of the event and made a daring move for fourth in the last corner. 'We had a great fight and I enjoyed myself,' admitted the British rider. 'All of us were pushing at our absolute maximum

and Alvaro was fantastic. Credit to Valentino as well because he recovered quite a lot of time and it is not easy to do that towards the end of the race.'

Teammate Bradley Smith made a brilliant start to the race, holding fourth place before dropping back behind more experienced riders. But the 22-year-old maintained the pressure and passed both the factory Ducatis on the last lap to snatch a great 8th place.

The Brno circuit in the Czech Republic will host the next round of the season on 25 August.
