Statement of Purpose	The purpose of the Irish National Intensive Care Unit Audit – Adult (INICUA-Adult) is to benchmark quality of care and outcomes in all adult intensive care units (ICUs) in Ireland and drive improvements in quality of care. This is done in partnership with the Intensive Care National Audit & Research Centre (ICNARC) in England.	
Objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Measure the quality of care in each ICU and benchmark this against other Units in Ireland and the UK. 2. Measure activity in each Unit to aid the planning of critical care services locally and nationally. 3. Provide data on complexity of care provided for each patient with potential to link this to reimbursement in the future. 4. Improve the quality of data for Hospital In-Patient Enquiry by providing data on diagnoses and procedures arising while the patient is in ICU. 5. Support Irish and international research to enhance patient care 6. Measure health care infection in ICU and drive improvement. 7. Provide a National Bed Bureau for critical care. 	
Target population	All patients admitted to adult general and specialist intensive care and high dependency units (called Units) as agreed by the NOCA Governance Committee, Project Board and determined by local service need.

The NOCA Governance Board is an independent voluntary board, convened to oversee and guide the strategic direction of NOCA. The NOCA Board has the authority to issue directions to NOCA Management with regard to the various clinical audit streams.

Individual NOCA audits are governed by a Governance Committee which makes strategic decisions relation to the audit and oversees operational plans. The Governance Committee includes relevant clinical and management stakeholders and two patient representatives. Ongoing implementation is progressed under the governance of the ICU Audit Project Board. This includes representatives from HSE; Acute Operations, Office of the Chief Information Officer and the Critical Care Programme and the NOCA clinical audit team. The clinical audit team (Audit Managers working with the NOCA Clinical Lead and supported by the NOCA executive team) is responsible for the development, implementation and reporting from the audit.

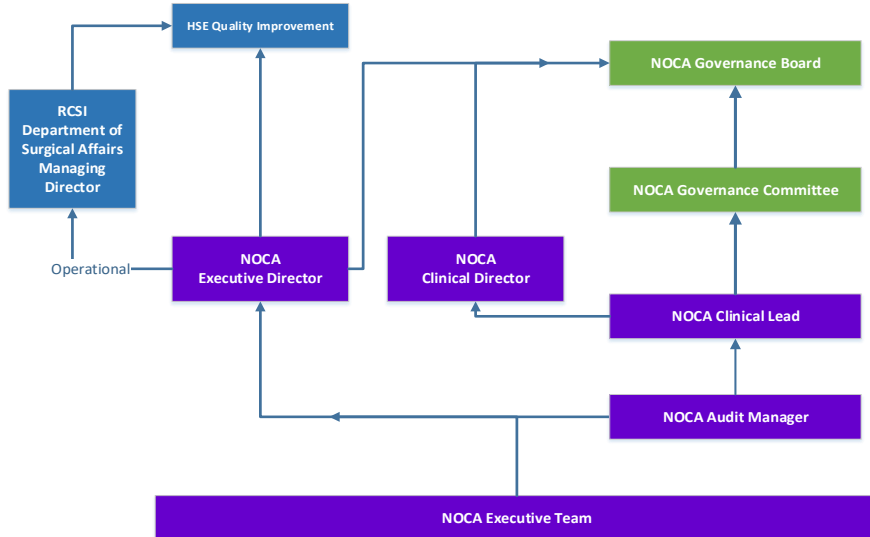





FIGURE 1: GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT TEAMS FOR NOCA AUDITS
