#### 1288 LGBT+ Policies

#### **Union Notes:**

### 1) Sexual Health:

- a) Data is collected by the NHS for men who sleep with men, but not for women who sleep with women.
- b) Often sex between two women is not considered 'sex'.
- c) There are false assumptions that women who sleep with women cannot catch STIs, etc.

## 2) Mental Health:

a) The statistics for mental health issues within the LGBT+ Community are staggering. LGBT+ people are at significantly higher risk of developing mental health issues.

## 3) Resources:

- a) The Union runs a very commendable Advice Centre.
- b) That issues that affect LGBT+ issues are very different to those others may experience.
- c) That there is no confidential resource area, either physical or online, at UEA other than speaking to a member of staff at the Advice Centre or Dean of Students.

## 4) Heteronormative views:

- a) The Union is an equal opportunities organisation, and this extends to the three media societies: Concrete, UEA:TV, and LiveWire.
- b) That heteronormative means portraying in the media the idea that being straight is normal.

### 5) LGBT+ Participation in Sport:

- a) At UEA, 52.8% of LGBT+ students who played sport were not out to their team mates.
- b) The Union has responsibility for ensuring access for all members to all its events and clubs/societies.

### 6) Blood Donation:

a) Blood donations save lives, but men are banned from giving blood if they have had sex with another man in the last year.

### 7) Gender Neutral Marriages:

a) Gender neutral marriages would mean that any two people, regardless of gender, can legally be married.

#### **Union Believes:**

#### 1) Sexual Health

- a) Facts need to be presented to dispel the myth discussed in Union Notes 1c.)
- b) That sex doesn't have to involve a penis! Sex between women who sleep with women is sex just as much as it is between two men or a man and a woman.
- c) Data collected by the NHS on women who sleep with women would be extremely useful in tackling common misconceptions.

### 2) Mental Health:

- a) Not enough is done to target the LGBT+ community as an 'at risk' group of developing mental health issues.
- b) That access to support is the right of all people, not a privilege.

### 3) Resources:

- a) LGBT+ people should be able to access general advice and information confidentially.
- b) That resources should be comprehensive and always free.

### 4) Heteronormative views:

- a) That wherever possible, heteronormative views should be challenged.
- b) That previous 'sex issues' of Concrete have had a severe lack of statistics/discussion/articles on LGBT+ sex and issues.

## 5) LGBT+ participation in sport:

- a) LGBT+ people are entitled and encouraged to play sport at UEA.
- b) No member should be discriminated against on the basis of their gender identity or sexuality.

### 6) Blood donation:

a) The ban prevents willing donors from giving blood and saving lives.

## 7) Gender Neutral Marriages:

- a) That LGBT+ people have valid relationships built on love, just as in any heterosexual relationship.
- b) That LGBT+ couples should be allowed to share all the same rights and privileges as heterosexual couples, in marriage or otherwise.

# **Union Resolves:**

### 1) Sexual Health:

- a) That when the Union is conducting a sexual health campaign, women who sleep with women are suitably informed of the risks outlined above.
- b) To support any campaign that calls on the NHS to collect data with regards to women who sleep with women.

### 2) Mental Health:

- a) To work with the NHS and Dean of Students to see how accessible students think mental health services are; and to find out their expectations/experiences of these services.
- b) To develop a major awareness campaign targeted at LGBT+ students giving them clear points of contact and reassurance.
- c) Such a campaign will not insult, isolate or intimidate its target audience.

### 3) Resources:

- a) To develop, with the University, an online resource centre, which will be confidential to access and available 24/7.
- b) That, when space allows, the Union will provide a room dedicated to being a 'safe-space' for the liberations officers. This room will be used for support group meetings, housing resources, and a base for campaigns. Should a new Union House building be made, it should include a room for each of the liberation campaigns, as is common practice amongst Universities worldwide.

### 4) Heteronormative views:

a) That the Union should **inform** and encourage Union media societies to challenge the heteronormative view. Especially when discussing issues like sex, etc.

## 5) LGBT+ Participation in Sport:

- a) That the Union should encourage sports clubs to engage with LGBT+ students. They could and should be encouraged to hold events such as:
  - i) Open training sessions these would also act as taster sessions for the sport. They could be open to all genders through a collaboration with both gendered sports teams (such as mens and women's football hosting a joint open training session).
  - ii) Hold regular mixed-gender friendlies.
  - iii) If possible, enter mixed gender competitions.
- b) That clubs will report back to the LGBT+ officer, or designated Full Time Officer, explaining what they had done that year to challenge discrimination in sport.

### 6) Blood Donation:

a) To campaign against any ban on donation of blood by men who sleep with men.

## 7) Gender Neutral Marriages:

- a) That the Union will publically support gender neutral marriages, and will support any legislation proposed by the government to introduce them.
- b) That the LGBT+ Officer will, on behalf of the Union, sign any such petitions supporting this.
