Church Services

We have a number of Church services throughout the school year, including our Welcome service, Harvest service, Christmas service, Easter service and Leaver's service. As with all our services, parents are more than welcome to attend, but are asked to sit at the back of the church so the children can sit in the pews. This term our services are:

Monday 9th October 9:15am Harvest service

Tuesday 19th December 1pm Christmas service

St Johns Frieth will also be holding a family Harvest service on Sunday 8th October at 3pm.

One Can Trust

We will be collecting food for the One Can Trust as part of our Harvest service.

One Can Trust Food Bank is a Wycombe Charity that gives out emergency food parcels to people who find themselves in a time of crisis. We are a community project and work with volunteers from churches and faith groups, schools, businesses, organisations and other charities who support local people.

People in our local area are hungry.

21% of children in Wycombe are in low income families. In some wards as many as 1 in 3 children live in poverty.

When you don't have any savings, when you have a sudden crisis such as bereavement, redundancy or illness, you may not be able to feed your family. We know these situations lead to family breakdown, crime, loss of housing and even more dreadful and heartbreaking results.

Food is donated by the people of Wycombe, Marlow and other towns and villages across South Bucks.

Volunteers collect, sort, store and pack the food into parcels.

Each parcel contains enough food to make 3 meals a day for a week.

We partner with professionals in front-line care who refer their clients to us for help.

People can either attend a food bank hub to pack their own parcel, or have a parcel delivered to them in some cases.

We also put people in touch with other agencies who can help resolve some of the issues underlying their crises.
