Dear Parents/Carers

In spite of the ongoing Arriva transport strike we will be providing transport to enable pupils to get to school throughout the remaining two weeks of term. The planned strike is scheduled for next Tuesday 12th - Thursday 14th December and the following week Wednesday 20th - Friday 22nd December. Please do not hesitate to contact the school office or Mrs Haynes if you need additional support.

Year 11 pupils have been working hard throughout the week on their GCSE mock examinations. Miss Parry our Lead Examinations Officer said 'I have been really impressed with the overall attitude and effort that each individual pupil has put into their examinations'. Next week Year 10 and all Key Stage 3 pupils will undertake their end of term examinations and tests and we are looking forward to a similar concerted effort and positive attitude to learning.

Please note the following dates which are changes to the original calendar. Pupils will return to school in the New Year on Thursday 11th January. There will be a full Parent/Carer Review Day on Monday 15th January. This day will replace the original Parent/Carer progress review afternoon (previously scheduled for Monday 18th December). EMA Review Day in January will follow the same format as the previous day of the 30th October. This will provide a great opportunity at the start of 2018 for pupils to revisit and, where necessary, reset targets relating to their attendance/punctuality, personal progress, behaviour for learning/rewards and any other specific area of school life such as wider participation/community involvement. Details of this day and the changes to the calendar will be posted out to you in person.

In the last week of term we will be providing a series of focussed and experiential learning forums for pupils to actively engage with. Pupils in Key Stage 3 will be receiving workshops helping them to regulate their social/emotional behaviour for learning. Pupils throughout the school will be joining in learning from a wide range of multi-agencies including the Police, National Health teams and Talking Therapies.

All pupils will have the opportunity to support our local community food bank. We are encouraging every pupil to donate an item of dry or tinned food as an act of kindness in the festive period. On the last day of term, Friday 22nd December, we are inviting all pupils and staff to wear their best festive sparkle. We will finish the day at 12.45 pm.

It's the most magical time of year - fairy lights and baubles, snowmen and Christmas trees. On 22nd December, we want it all on a jumper.

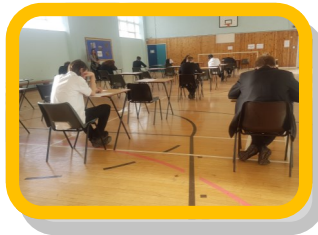
On 15th December - save the children are holding their annual Christmas jumper day, all over the country, thousands of people will be donning their daftest, most wonderful woollies - all for a great cause.

Please help us help the local community in making this Christmas count.

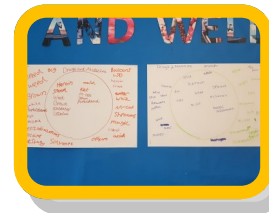
Mock Exams

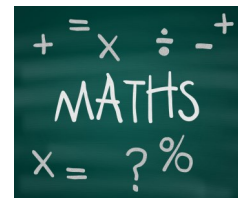
KS3 News
