Tesco Blue Coin Scheme

Start of the School Day / Attendance

Please may we remind you that we have been instructed by the Government to mark children who are not present when the registers are taken at 8.45 a.m. as **absent**, and then mark them as **late entrants** if they subsequently arrive.

There must be a **valid reason** for all absences – a note please to explain illness, doctor, dentist, etc. will be required. If we have no explanation, it has to be assumed truancy has occurred and the absence will be recorded as unauthorised and shown on your child's annual written report.

Regular occurrences of either of the above issues could result in visits from the Educational Support Adviser and, at worst, appearances in court.

To prevent these issues from arising, please **make sure your child is here by 8:30/8.35 a.m. or send a note or telephone call to alert us to the reason for absence.**

Leave of Absence

A child's illness should normally be the **only** reason for absence.

In exceptional circumstances ie a family crisis or for Services Personnel, the Head Teacher **may** grant leave of absence from school. Requests must be made in writing well in advance of the dates for which leave is requested, a form is available from the school office.

Parents are **legally** required to ensure that their child/ren attend school regularly. Nothing undermines a pupil's educational progress more than frequent absences. The governors / school expect the co-operation of parents in securing the regular attendance of pupils at school.

Just a reminder that Hampshire County Council is implementing a Fixed Penalty Notice policy which will result in fines for unauthorised absence. As a Hampshire School we will need to adhere to this policy. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us. Part of the assessment of attendance incorporates lateness and it is essential that children are in class promptly in the mornings. They must be in their classrooms at 8.45am, to ensure that they are not marked late in the register, which could result in a fine for persistent lateness.

Free School Lunches

School lunches can be ordered on a daily basis and are **free** to all children in the Infant School. Children may still bring healthy packed lunches to school if they prefer.

Signing in Book

May I remind all visitors to the School during the day, including helping parents, that it is necessary for you to collect a lanyard and to sign the book at the Office Reception desk, upon your arrival and before your departure. Children who are taken out of school during the day also need to be signed in and out. This is a requirement of our Fire Safety Regulations.

Emergency Numbers

To ensure our emergency names and telephone numbers are up to date and accurate we would appreciate the names and telephone numbers of childminders in addition to our normal emergency contacts. **Please inform the office when any of the above information changes.** Thank you. In accordance with the Data Protection Act, your child's name, address, medical information and emergency contact numbers will be processed electronically for administrative purposes in the School Office.

Back Packs

Due to a lack of cloakroom space, we would be very grateful if you would send your child to school with just their lunch box, book bag with plastic wallet inside and no back packs. This will ensure that the children can hang their coats and PE bags on their pegs. Please refrain from adorning school bookbags with keyrings as bookbags will not fit in classroom drawers.

Parking of Cars

Please may I remind all parents that at the beginning and end of the day we **only** have parking spaces for parents who have disabled permits and can display a school parking permit. Please can I also ask you not to block cars in when picking up and to respect our local residents when choosing somewhere to park. Disabled parking permits for this academic year are available from the school office on production of a valid blue badge. Limited parking permits are available for Crossways Carpark (by the Doctors surgery), valid from 3-4pm during term time. Parking is free until 9am. Please do not use the private small car park at St Johns Church as this is intended for users of the church building and pre-school. Thank you.

Use of the Playdale and slide

Children should not be allowed to use the slide and "Playdale" equipment before and after school. This equipment should only be used when supervised by a member of my staff during the school day. Should your child have an accident before or after school when there is no school supervision, they will not be covered by our insurance.

Scooters on site

At Hook Infant school we have a policy of **no** scooters to be ridden inside the school grounds. This decision was made to ensure the health and safety of all children and their parents/carers as they move around the site. There are now three scooter pods on the school site and we are happy that scooters remain in school all day to save you carrying them home. Thank you in advance for your assistance in this safety matter.

Pick up time

Please can we ask parents **not** to enter the school grounds until after 3:00pm. The teachers are still delivering lessons and it is quite distracting for young children to see their parents waiting.

Birthdays

Birthdays, as we all know, are a very important part of a child's life and we celebrate your child's birthday in school in a variety of ways. We sing "Happy Birthday" either in the classroom and/or in whole school assemblies, present your child with a birthday sticker and try and make them feel very special for the day. In the past, many parents like to provide sweets for the class to take home as part of the celebrations, which we appreciate is a lovely gesture but, in line with our "Healthy School" status, we do not allow this. Continuing with birthday celebrations, we would like to ask you to try and give out as many birthday invitations yourself. We are more than happy for you or your childminder to stand outside the classroom door and try and catch as many invited families as possible before or after school. Should you not be able to catch one or two invitees, we will be happy to place these **few** invites in bookbags. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation with these birthday arrangements.

Fliers in book bags

From time to time you will find fliers in your child's book bag. The school does not endorse these companies or events, but merely acts as a vehicle to keep you informed of such events or services available.

Earrings

Please can I remind all parents that children are not allowed to wear any jewellery in PE sessions, for health and safety reasons. My staff are not allowed to remove your child's earrings and cannot assist in their re-insertion. Therefore I would I ask all parents to remove your child's earrings on PE days so that they do not miss out on a vital part of the curriculum. PE days are displayed on the window of your child's classroom or at the Year 2 external door. Thank you for your support in this matter.

The teachers will be pleased to see you on the following days throughout the year:-

Close liaison between teachers and parents is very important in the interests of the children's progress and I would suggest that you try to make use of these slots. Please ensure you arrange with the teacher a suitable date. To accommodate working parents and those who are unable to attend face to face meetings, we are happy to arrange consultation via the telephone during the above stated times. Please could you see your child's class teacher should you wish to book a face to face or telephone appointment.

Library parent helpers

Year 1 and 2 classes are looking for parent helpers to help with their library book change day. Please speak to the class teacher if you are able to help. A current DBS certificate is needed and details can be found by speaking to Mrs Evans in the school office.
