Gwithian -

We will be learning and rehearsing our new class story 'The Enormous Turnip'. In Maths we are looking at the addition of small numbers. In Science we are going to be continuing to explore the dietary needs of animals in the wild. In Topic we are going to be researching to create a healthy product. Remember to keep an eye on our class webpage as we are updating it!

Sennen -

In Sennen Class we are continuing with our fiction book 'The Owl who Was Afraid of The Dark' and we will be innovating it as a class to 'The Mouse who was afraid of cheese'. In Maths we are having a subtraction week, thinking about using our number bonds to subtract and then moving on to using written methods to help us. In Science next week we are going to be thinking about our organs, in particular, our heart and why it is important. In Topic we are going to be thinking about the life cycle of a bird; looking at each stage quite closely.

Fistral -

In Fistral next week we will be innovating our class story 'Ferdinand'. In maths year 3 and 4 will be looking at number and place value linked to subtraction. In topic we will be identifying physical geographical features. In science year 3 and 4 will identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

Pentire -

We will be learning a new class story called 'Journey to Jo'burg'. This is a story centred around a family in the time of apartheid in South Africa. We will be rehearsing the story and completing activities around the class novel.

Marazion -

In English next week, Marazion will be learning the Greek myth: "Theseus and the Minotaur". We will continue to use the written method of column subtraction and will develop their problem solving skills problems.

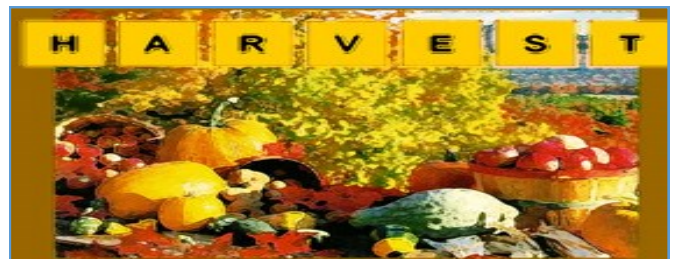
