🌸 Remembrance Day Sunday November 13th 2016 🌸

November is the time of the year when we wear a red poppy in memory of those who sacrificed their lives for us during wars. The eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month marks the signing of the Armistice, on 11th November 1918, to signal the end of World War One. At 11 am on 11 November 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare. To honour those who have sacrificed themselves to secure and protect our freedom, children may bring a small donation to school and receive a poppy to wear with pride.

The donations received are given to the Royal British Legion, a charity dedicated to helping war veterans.
