Porthpean Class

Another super week in Year 1. Next week we will be continuing to embed our sounds in Read Write Inc. In maths, we will also continue to use the language greater than, less than and equal to including the signs $<$ $>$ $=$. Our topic will begin to focus on celebrating our local community and school.

Pendower Class

Year 2 have had great fun reading stories about different characters from The Great Fire of London. Next week, we are going to be looking at the different equipment that was used to help try to put out the fire. We will be also continue to explore the apparatus by using our coordination, balance and agility.

Charlestown Class

Next week Year 4 will be working on setting descriptions in English. In maths we will be looking at addition methods. For science next week, we will be making electrical circuits.

Year 5 will be continuing to learn to use the short column method for addition and subtraction and will be looking at how to use the inverse operation to check their answers. In English, children have worked extremely hard to complete their evacuee letters which are now beautifully displayed on their handmade paper. In Science next week, we will be learning about the effects of air resistance on different objects, specifically parachutes. .
