Eagle Runners is a new running group for adults and over 16s in Culcheth.

There are 2 free weekly sessions, aimed at runners with various levels of experience or ability. They take place on Monday mornings from 9:30 and Wednesday early evenings at 6pm. Runs are led by Graham, who is our running club coach and an experienced endurance runner. He is a qualified Leader in Running Fitness, which means he has been trained by England Athletics and has a current DBS check & insurance.

The meeting place for all sessions is the Shaw street car park, next to the Spice Lounge and they last for 45 mins to an hour.

Monday's session is suitable for beginners who want to improve and gradually increase the distance they can run. These are run/walk sessions, covering about 3Km.

Wednesday's early evening runs are suitable for occasional or weekly runners who are happy at 5K or longer runs and want to do a bit more, add some structure to training and/or just fancy running in a group and meet other local runners.
