FOREST SCHOOL

Here at Penryn Primary we celebrate learning not only in the classroom, but also outdoors using our extensive school grounds. Mrs Malham has joined our staff and is passionate about the outdoors. She is a qualified Forest School Leader and will be leading outdoor learning and Forest School sessions.

Forest School is a practice that gives young people the opportunity to develop self-learning through natural play and positive outdoor experiences. Young people can learn about tree and plant life and how to protect them, fire safety and camp fire cooking, shelter building, knots, safe use of tools, woodland crafts, natural art activities and more.

Throughout the year, children at Penryn will be taking part in outdoor learning and Forest School sessions, during all safe weather conditions. The school will provide your child with a waterproof jacket and trousers, but we ask that your child brings in a pair of wellies or old shoes on their Forest School day (except for reception children). If you do have any old wellies that your child has grown out of, the school would be very grateful for any donations.
