music at the Royal Hospital School

Set in 200 acres of stunning Suffolk countryside overlooking the River Stour, the Royal Hospital School is a thriving co-educational boarding and day school for 11 to 18 years old. The School has a long tradition of musical excellence, enhanced by a Music School opened by the School's music patron, John Rutter in 2008.

More recently, a £1/4 million investment in new Bechstein pianos throughout the School and a stunning Fazioli Grand for the Recital Hall has demonstrated a commitment to enriching what is on offer for young musicians.

Situated beside the Music School is the magnificent 1930s chapel which is of cathedral proportions and has seating for over 1000 people. It is famed for its exceptional four-manual “romantic” organ and the smaller two-manual “classical” instrument.



MUSIC MAKING



THE CHAPEL CHOIR

When 750 pupils and a further 100 teachers and other members of staff sing together each morning in chapel it is often referred to as the “Holbrook Sound”. The Chapel Choir has become one of the most important

and prestigious ensembles within the Music Department, performing regularly at St Paul's Cathedral, St Martin-in-the-Fields and the Royal Albert Hall. Tours abroad have included Paris, Rome, Germany and Malta. In October 2018 they are visiting New York.

SCHOOL BAND

The School Band is another music department “flagship”. Apart from the ceremonial duties unique to the Royal Hospital School, accompanying the impressive parades and sunset ceremonies, it has performed at many national events. The most recent have been the opening of the National Museum of the Royal Navy's Jutland exhibition in the presence of HRH The Princess Royal, and the rugby internationals at Twickenham. The Band has also recorded several CDs and toured abroad to the USA, South Africa and Canada.

HOLBROOK CHORAL SOCIETY

The Holbrook Choral Society has been based at the Royal Hospital School for nearly 30 years and it provides an important link between the School and the wider community. The Society includes local people, parents, staff and pupils and major performances have included Messiah – Handel, Requiem – Mozart and The Dream of Gerontius – Elgar.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Music Scholarships are awarded annually to pupils who demonstrate potential in their music making. Prospective candidates are encouraged to visit the School informally and meet the Director of Music from whom further information is available.

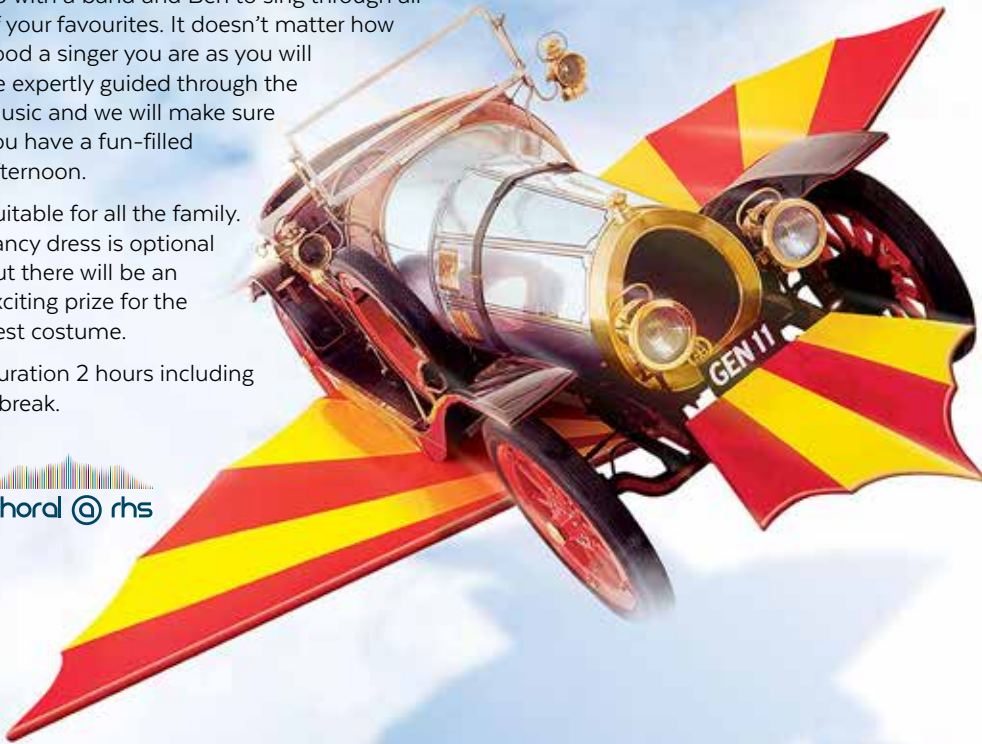

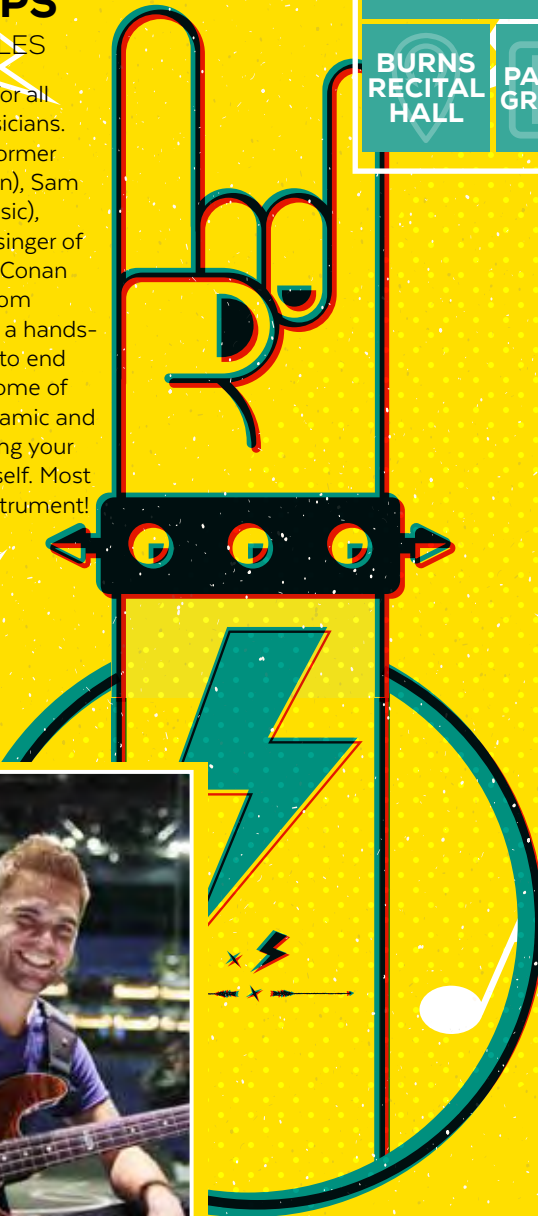

The 4th East of England Organ Day celebrates dance, with a daylong feast of events inspired by human movement and featuring the School's historic, 4-manual Hill, Norman & Beard organ.

The organ scholars of King's College, Cambridge, Richard Gowers and Henry Websdale, kick off the day with 'At the Ballet', a programme of duets by Stravinsky and Tchaikovsky, and featuring Debussy's lush symphonic poem, *Prélude à l'après-midi d'un faune*. Richard and Henry will be joined by young classical dancers from across Suffolk.

Stravinsky's score for the infamous music-dance collaboration of 1913, *The Rite of Spring*, remains accessible to us, while Nijinsky's choreography exists only in fragments. In her lecture, Emeritus Professor Janet Lansdale (University of Surrey) will look at how the concepts of rite, fertility, spring, and death, embodied in this work, continue to inspire choreographers to this day.

We are pleased to once again be hosting the young winners of the London Organ Competition, promoted by the Organ Club. The 2017 laureates will give a joint recital on the chapel's Grand Organ.

The afternoon will be given over to you! The chapel will be the venue for a giant community tea dance, with groups or individuals encouraged to submit musical requests to the School's four organists. Come and dance to your favourite tunes - anything from Glenn Miller to Strauss and Beyoncé!

Andrew Dewar's musical career started at an early age; he began playing the organ at his local church in Yeovil (Somerset) at the age of nine. With a scholarship to Wells Cathedral School in 1996 he studied the organ with Rupert Gough, David Sanger, David Briggs (improvisation) and harpsichord with Dr David Ponsford. From 1999-2000 he was Organ Scholar at Wells Cathedral before moving to Germany where he studied at the Musikhochschule, Stuttgart, with Prof Dr Ludger Lohmann.

He was winner of one of the most prestigious of all competitions - St Albans - but has also won a host of other international organ competitions, inter alia Dublin, Wiesbaden, Berlin, Landau an der Isar, plus prizes in Montreal, Schramberg and the Julius Reubke Prize at Erfurt. Andrew's extensive concert diary has taken him on tours to Russia and Northern America, and frequent engagements throughout Europe. In addition to his solo recital work, he takes masterclasses and sits on adjudication panels, most recently as a jury member at the International BACH/LISZT Competition in Weimar/Erfurt. He is now Organist at the American Cathedral, Paris, where he has charge of the large Cavallé-Coll organ of 1887. Alongside his position in Paris, Andrew has recently been appointed Assistant Professor of Organ at the Royal College of Music in London.

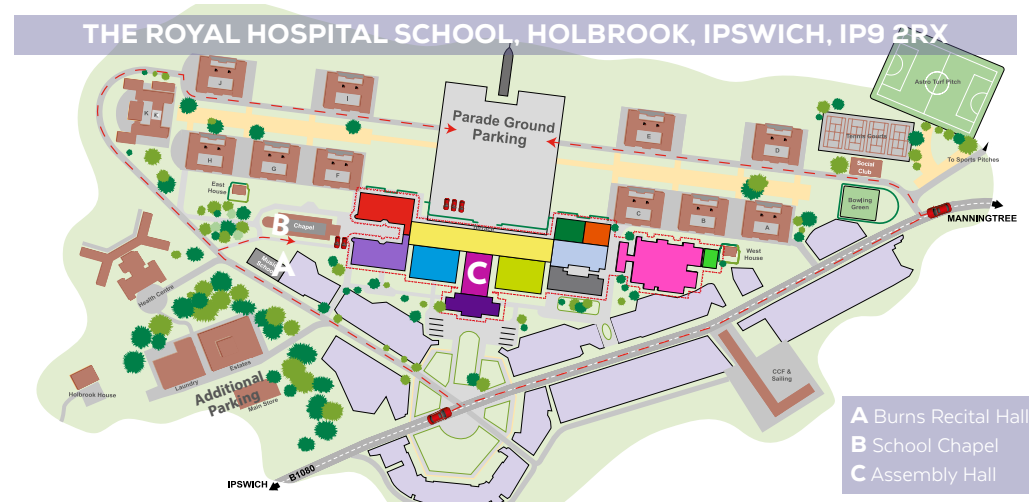

getting to the Royal Hospital School



By Car

The Royal Hospital School is located on the B1080 between the villages of Stutton and Holbrook and has ample free parking.

Access to the parking area is via the road leading to the Music School.

Disabled parking is available outside the chapel.

From the A14 take the exit signposted A137 towards Ipswich. At the roundabout you will see a sign to the Royal Hospital School which will direct you under the Orwell Bridge on the B1456 from which take a right on to the B1080 through the village of Holbrook and onwards to the School.

From the A12 take the exit for the B1070 towards East Bergholt and continue towards Manningtree where a sign to the Royal Hospital School will direct you from the roundabout on the A137 towards Ipswich. From the A137 turn right towards Stutton, passing through the village and onwards to the School.

By train

The nearest train stations are at Ipswich and Manningtree and taxis are readily available. Also within easy reach are the ferry port of Harwich and Stansted, Luton, Gatwick and Heathrow Airports
