The aim of this extension task is to:

Develop an understanding of the impact of multiple births on China's "One Child" policy

Why Not?
It's just for fun!

Context of task:

On rare occasions a woman might give birth to triplets or even quads. You need to consider how this impacts on China's "One Child" policy.

You may wish to address some or all of the questions below or even develop some questions of your own

Questions / Issues to address:

1. Use ideas from science lessons to help explain the reasons why this family have had 4 children.
2. Consider the feelings of the family to a situation of multiple births
3. Consider the feelings of the children to a situation where they have several brothers or sisters
4. Try to find out how multiple births are viewed by the Chinese authorities and by Chinese society as a whole
5. Consider ways that multiple births may link in with issues of overpopulation and consequences of this such as climate change

You could present this as a powerpoint presentation, a leaflet, as a video interview or any other presentation form. It is important that you don't cut and paste bits from the internet. Try to keep your response clear and focused
