

Maths – Summer Term - Week 3

Number Recognition

Last week in F1, we were practising counting. This week we are going to start looking at number recognition. Here are some activities you can do at home. Next week we will be moving onto to number recognition and matching.

Cars

Label some toy cars either 0-5 or 0-10. Then create a car park on paper or cardboard with the corresponding numbers. Ask your child if they can park the cars in the correct parking spot. You can be creative and adapt this to your child's favourite toy.



Daily Exercise

If you are able to get out for daily exercise can you spot any numbers on your walk? Look at house numbers, numbers on wheelie bins, buses, registration plates, speed limits etc. Point out any digits 0-10 to your child eg 48, point out the 4 and the 8.



Skittles

Play a game of skittles and see if you can say what number you have knocked down. If you don't have any skittles at home try making your own skittles out of plastic bottles, plant pots or even boxes, anything you can find at home.

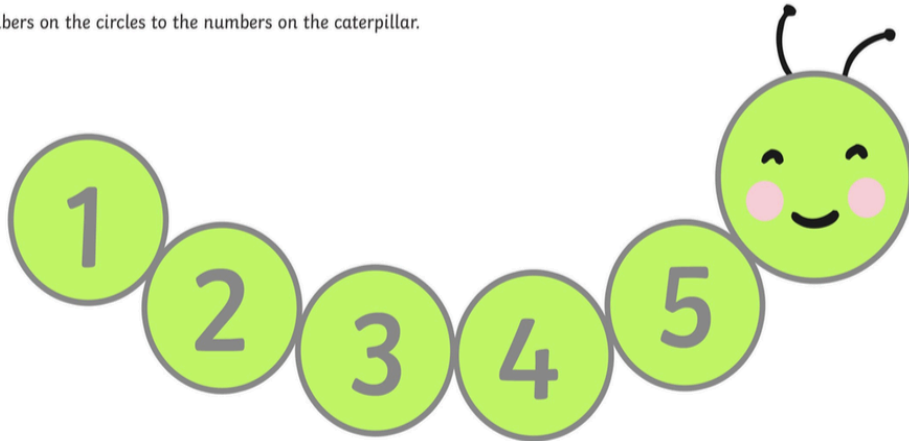


Caterpillar matching
