Bees and flowers

Lots of plants rely on insects like bees to reproduce .To make a seed, a flower needs to be pollinated. Pollen from one flower needs to travel to another. Bees are very important for carrying the pollen between flowers. To encourage bees to visit them, flowers have colourful petals and an attractive scent. Some flowers give the bees a sugary reward called nectar too. It's not just plants that need bees; we need them too. Without them we'd have very little food. 

Requirements for growth

A healthy plant is usually upright with green leaves. Plants need air, light, warmth, water and nutrients to

If a plant doesn't have one of these requirements it could affect its growth or even die.

For example, a plant that is kept in a dark place will grow tall and spindly in search of light and then become weak and die.

A plant that is not watered will have a weak stem and dried-up leaves and will eventually die.

A seed will not produce a plant at all if it is kept too cold. The seed needs warmth to germinate (develop from a seed into a plant) and start to grow into a
