

Impact of 2018 / 2019 Sport Premium Funding Spend

- This year we have sought to maintain our growing involvement in sports and physical activity outside of the curriculum, through active playtimes, introduction of the Daily Mile, active lessons, after school clubs, daily wake-up shake up activities and in taking part in more festivals and competitions through the South Tyneside School Sports Network.
- In the academic year 2018-2019, children chose their own after school clubs by responding to a whole school questionnaire. In response to this, we ran a KS1 multi skills after school club and KS2 dance after school club at no charge to the children.
- **100% of pupils participated in a School Games sports festival** again this year, some year groups more than once (Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6).
- Again, Year 5 and 6 entered league and cup competitions for which they received extra lunch-time coaching.
- Our football team went from strength to strength winning their league and reaching the semi-finals in the Bishop's Cup, again **increasing pupil participation in competitive school sport** and showing the impact of their extra coaching sessions.
- Our KS2 SEND children became county champions in the Topsportsability festival, raising their self-esteem and confidence through involvement in competitive sporting activity.
- Equipment was also purchased, to maintain and develop a more active playground, in accordance with what lunchtime staff suggested was needed, following their active playground training.
- Year 6 were trained as Young Leaders through the Playmaker Award coaching, to **increase participation in sport and physical activity during playtimes and lunchtimes.**
- All children in school took part in a whole school PE day to **raise the profile of sport and physical activity** and took part in wake up shake up exercises and a dance-a-thon. All classes also enjoyed **some specialist coaching** through Hoopstarz and a skipping day, which cost £450.
- Year 2 and Year 4 took part in the Skipping Festival Project at St Joseph's Academy, competing against other primary schools from South Tyneside; again, **increasing pupil participation in competitive school sport.** Both year groups **took part in**

specialised training in the lead up to the events. Individuals and groups of children won many Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. The cost of this was £700.

- All children took part in a competitive sports day with medals being awarded for first three teams.

The total spend from Sport Premium for this year was: £9343.55
