



## East Boldon Juniors Maths Home Learning Grid

Here is the recommended daily maths activities to be completed at home.



### 1. Daily completion of White Rose Maths activity.

This is a great resource for daily maths learning, recognised and promoted by The Department of Education as well as ourselves too! The sessions begin with a video to teach the concept, activity sheets to practise the skill and then answers to check learning afterwards. We would recommend an adult is part of the process where possible. All lessons are planned specifically for the units your child would be doing right now in school. This ensures no future gaps in knowledge when they return to school.

#### So where do I find these resources and what do I do exactly?

- Click on the set of lessons for your child's year group.
- Watch the video (with an adult or on your own)
- Find a calm space where your child can work for about 20-30 minutes. Then try the questions.
- Use the video to support your child as they work through a lesson or find any of the questions tricky.

#### I haven't started any of these yet, where do I start?

No worries! Start at Week 1 as the learning is built on in small steps so jumping to Week 3 will prove problematic!

#### Can I use another year group?

For the majority of children, they should stick to their year group materials. If your child has difficulties in mathematics, they may want to revisit objectives as revision from earlier year groups.

#### Can I do a maths marathon and do a week's worth of lessons (all five) in one day?

No. This would not be beneficial to you or your child. For optimum learning, children should work for frequent, short bursts. This is far more beneficial than one long session a week, as children will be revisiting and revising their skills so internalising in their memory. This is why we recommend a daily maths session of around 30 minutes. A maximum amount would be two lessons a day; anymore and it will be unproductive.

### 2. TTRockstars online resource

A minimum of 10 minutes per day would be hugely beneficial at securing these key facts, fundamental to any success in mathematics!
