

How can I use this with my children?

This word mat is packed full of examples of adverbs that your child can use in their own writing. Whether they want to describe how, when or where, they'll find an example to suit their needs.

How does this help my children's learning?

Adverbs are used to clarify how, when, where, how often or how much something happens. They add detail to verbs and help to make your child's writing more clear and interesting for the reader.

Ideas for further learning:

To help your child become familiar with the meaning of the different adverbs on the word mat, they could try this sentence challenge. Can they create a sentence for each of the adverbs on the mat?

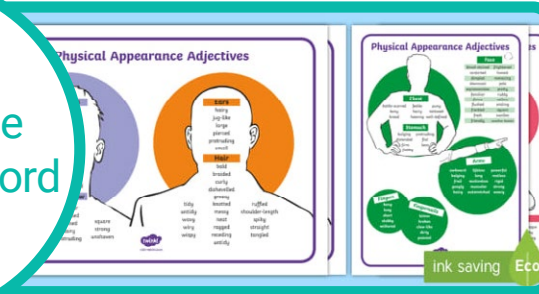

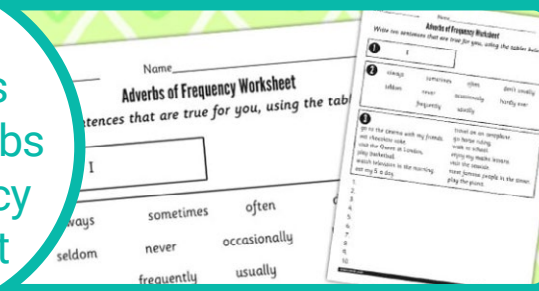
