

What types of scripts are we looking for?

- Scripts intended for theatre/stage/live performance
- Scripts that haven't been sent to Talawa before (unless they've been developed significantly since your last submission)
- Underserved perspectives scripts by Black heritage, marginalised writers (e.g. disabled, queer, refugee, working class writers) however, you do not have to write specifically about these perspectives or experiences
- Scripts about the Black experience both local to Talawa (Croydon) as well as from the whole UK
- Scripts that tell a story we may have not seen or heard before
- Scripts with smaller casts.

Who can submit?

- Black heritage writers currently living in the UK, of all levels of experience
- You must be over 18 to apply
- If you've submitted work to us in the past and still match the requested criteria

For writers interested in applying for our Introductory Writers' Group (IWG):

- To be eligible you will need to be based within zones 1-6 London and able to travel to Croydon on a weekly basis
- You also can't currently be in education or have done a writer's course previously
- You cannot have had a play produced professionally at time of applying, be on commission or have been nominated for a professional award for your writing
- Should we discover you have, we are within our rights to remove you from the group.

What can't we read?

- Scripts that have not been made for stage / live performance
- Scripts created with or edited using AI
- Scripts not sent in .pdf format (if you don't have a dedicated app, you can convert your document for free online!)
- Scripts that are less than 10 pages if your script is over 80 pages, we cannot guarantee the whole script will be read
- No musicals though we will accept plays that have some musical elements in them
- Scripts with multiple writers it needs to be yours and yours alone
- If you are not based in the UK
- Please do not submit your play if it has already been professionally produced
- The script is not predominately written in English. Talawa is a UK based theatre company with English as our production language
- If you send us a script outside of the submission entry window
- If you don't complete the form alongside your submission. Please email <u>scripts@talawa.com</u> if you need a way to apply that we haven't provided for yet.
- Scripts with large casts (more than 8)
