
THE CODE OF GOOD CONDUCT

- ▲ Length of observation **limited to 30 mn**, 15 mn if other boats are waiting;
- Do not approach closer than 100 meters;
- ★ Keep your distance in case of new-born animals;
- Do not try to touch or feed animals even if they come voluntary near the boat;
- Do not suddenly change speed or direction;
- Stop immediately any approach if animals attempt to move away from observers and are disturbed.



PRECAUTIONARY AREA

- One boat at the time with a limited speed of 5 knots;
- Sounders and sonars must be switched off to limit acoustic disturbance;
- Keep a **parallel trajectory** to the animals.
















THE ACCOBAMS

The ACCOBAMS is the Agreement on the Conservation of Cetaceans in the Black Sea, Mediterranean Sea and contiguous Atlantic area. Through a range of recommendations, it fosters the State members to settle a framework to manage and develop whale-watching activities according to good practices. The "High Quality Whale-Watching" certificate is an ACCOMBAMS registered trademark established since 2014.

THE PELAGOS SANCTUARY

The Mediterranean Sea owns the largest International Marine Protected Area located between France, Monaco and Italy: the Pelagos Sanctuary. This Sanctuary was created to protect all the marine mammals and their habitats from anthropogenic threats within the area. On behalf of wellconducted and respectful observations, the Pelagos Sanctuary edited a Code of Good Conduct. The Pelagos Sanctuary is the pilot area for the rollout of the "High Quality Whale-Watching®" distinction.

- Do not go swimming with marine mammals
- Do not use aerial survey so there is less pressure on animals
