BRITISH EMPIRE MEDAL FOR DAVID FURNELL!

On October 31st 2016, David Furnell received his British Empire Medal in a ceremony at County Hall, Hertford for services to charities and the community. The award was presented by the Lord Lieutenant of Hertfordshire, The Countess of Verulam.

David is a member and Past Chairman of Hemel Hempstead 41 Club (Region 19) and a Past Chairman of Hemel Hempstead Round Table.

It is often said that David is like a Duracell bunny, never pausing or stopping, with endless energy. As well as all the normal activities associated with Table membership, David was a Governor of Woodfield School for the disabled and even after stepping down, he has been a lifelong supporter for over 30 years.

Heavily involved in the early days of the Anthony Nolan appeal, he worked

closely with Past Table National President Simon Dyson.

Other areas include being a Trustee of Dacorum Community Trust helping local organisations and charities and more lately in the Dacorum Enterprise Board as an incubator for small business.

He was heavily involved in the Maylands Partnership and



helped Hemel recover from the largest ever peacetime explosion and fire at the Buncefield Oil Depot.

For thirteen years he was a Trustee of the Boxmoor Trust, which manages some 480 acres and in recent years has established a learning centre for children.

Now a Committee member of the Vintage Sports Car Club, the VSCC, he is competing in this coming weekend's London to Brighton car run.

His latest venture was to exercise his right as a Freeman of the Borough of Dacorum to drive several sheep through the town. With the Mayor and other Freemen involved, David arranged sponsorship of the sheep, all of which misbehaved, and raised about £3000 for charity.

In addition to the above he established Furnell Transport in 1967 and is now

the Chairman of this leading local transport firm.

I could go on, he never stops!!!

The National Photographic Competition kicked off last month!


As they were last year, entries will be published on line when voting opens, and the voting itself will also be on line so that as many of you as possible can cast your votes, not just those attending National Conference.

We all had to get up at about 3:30am

on the Friday in order to converge on Manchester airport and catch a 7:50am flight to Charleroi. From there it was a bus transfer to the railway station and a train ride to Eupen, changing at Liège. We finally arrived in Eupen around 2pm and decided to go cosmopolitan by ordering some Belgian beers in German in an Indian restaurant. As you do... We then ordered pizzas in Italian... Why in German to start with? Because the town of Eupen, less than 10 miles from the German border, is the capital of Belgium's only 76,000-strong German-speaking Community.

Unfortunately, we were not all in the same hotel. I was in the Kloster-Heidberg in the town centre while Andy and Mark were in the HQ hotel, the "Ambassador", just under a mile South from there. After eating, we checked into our respective rooms and freshened up, and I walked over to the Ambassador with Switzerland's Claudio Matasci.

A pre-dinner drink was served before

we were all transported off to "Atelier by Marc Nüchtern" about a mile further South from the Ambassador, where we were treated to an excellent get-together party and a barbecue. It took some persuasion to keep Mark from joining the local dance troupe...

The party wound down around midnight. It had been a long day for us and the AGM proper was to take



place the following morning so we decided to beat a strategic retreat to our hotels.

Well rested on the Saturday morning, the Belgians and some of the international delegates made their way to the Jünglingshaus, the centre for the local culture committee. The international guests were welcomed and then invited on a tour of the town on foot while the AGM proper took place.

Unlike at home, the National Executive of 41 Club Belgium doesn't hand over to the incoming Executive at the AGM but at the gala dinner that takes place in the evening. Outgoing President Jean-Claude Joustens was therefore presiding over the banner exchange that took place before. As well as GB&I, there were overseas delegations present from Austria, France, Germany, Italy, Luxemburg, Romania and Switzerland. The Dutch delegation had to return home immediately after the AGM.



41 Club to support Teenage Cancer Trust in 2017

At the recent October National Council Meeting it was agreed unanimously to support a National Community Service Project next year to help the Teenage Cancer Trust charity. Teenage Cancer Trust helps the



seven young people between 13 and 24 that get diagnosed with Cancer every day in the UK. They provide support and advice to find the expert help a young person needs from the moment they hear the word Cancer spoken.

41 Club is to offer manpower and practical help as the Teenage Cancer Trust organise a Sponsored Walk from their venues in Glasgow to London. The walk will start on the 17th April 2017 and finish on 6th July 2017. Teenage Cancer Trust will promote the walk nationally and take registrations via their Website. Competitors can choose to walk the whole way, walk each section which will take a week or just walk for a single day. They will be asked to raise a minimum of £10 per mile for the charity. The walk is not continuous and will have breaks overnight and at weekends plus the walkers will be expected to find their own accommodation and transport. The walk will be limited to 30 people a day walking between fixed points.

41 Club will provide practical help and manpower from local Clubs where the walk passes through a 41 Club Region. Each stage will need a small team to organise the route, the walkers, the maps, set people off and welcome them at the end of their day's walk. These teams can be different Clubs at the

start and finish and if they liaise with each other they don't even need to do the walk, although it's hoped some 41'ers may join in.

Some of the stages of the walk are already being organised by regular sup-

porters of Teenage Cancer Trust, however there are still a number where they have no support to organise things. Sections still to be supported are Manchester to Nottingham, Nottingham to Leicester, Leicester to Cambridge, Cambridge to Birmingham, Birmingham to Cardiff and finally Bristol to Southampton.

Your 41 Club National Councillor will be in touch with you if your Club is on the route of the walk and he will have details of how you can help and support this very worthwhile initiative. This is a huge step forward for 41 Club and the first time, certainly in this Millennium, that we've undertaken a Community Service Project on such a large scale. It endorses our Strategic Plan to do more in the community and raises the profile of 41 Club nationally.

This beautiful, award-winning park offers three large fields with very large grass pitches — all serviced with electricity. The park has its own Clubhouse with bar and small restaurant. We hope, if we get enough caravans, we can fill one field, the one by the Clubhouse, shop and reception.

The programme is very simple. A welcome drink session on the Friday night, and a hog roast and musical entertainment on the Saturday night. The rest of the time is free so that those attending can enjoy the sites around the area, which includes Woodstock, Burford, the Cotswolds and of course the 'Dreaming Spires' of Oxford.

Apart from the Saturday night, everyone 'does their own thing' with meals etc. The Clubhouse can offer bar meals but can get busy and you may have to wait. Or you can organise a barbeque, go down the pub or just have your meal in the caravan. The same applies to breakfast every day.

We arrived in Bucharest early morning, and were met by Romania's IRO, Aurel Jianu. He drove us into town for lunch, and let us stay at his son's apartment for the night. We met up with him at the Bucharest Round Table meeting that we attended that night. Aurel

picked us up to take us to the meeting which was in a nice restaurant. About 15 Round Table members and 4 Ladies' Circle members were present, and 4 older guys who should have been in 41 Club but who were still Tablers! (apparently due to the fact that there was no 41 Club). This was a meeting to organize their next year's National AGM.



They are a friendly bunch of guys and we have offered to help them get a 41 Club started. After the meeting they offered to take us into town but can you believe I turned the offer down! I had not slept for two days and was just shattered.

Next morning Aurel picked us up to drive down to Craiova for the 41 Club AGM. This was a 3-hour drive. We stopped for coffee halfway and met some other 41ers from Aurel's own club who were on their way.

The welcome party on the Friday night was a hog roast. I think the hog had been running around the woods for a number of years, but they liked it, and the atmosphere and the local beer were good.



There was some traditional music playing. Despite sitting right next to it, Dave still managed to fall fast asleep on the table!

got going about 10:30-ish. The meeting started with an introduction in English for international guests, who were from GB&I, Germany, Belgium and the Netherlands. After the meeting we were then taken on a walking tour of the town with the President's wife. It's an attractive town and they were very proud of their parks, which looked fairly new, and their small zoo.

After the dinner we sat talking into the early hours to the new President Marius Coca, and the Secretary, and Chairman of Brașov. They were very upset that Andy Waite did not get the post of International Secretary.

We worked from 7am to 7pm at night refurbishing the building. We put a new roof on it and we put in shower rooms and wardrobes with locks on for the kids. We had no spare time for sightseeing, only for a few pints that cost us 10 pence a pint in the '90s, but there would be rats running around your feet in the bar.

On Monday, Aurel took us to an orphanage that was run by a 41er's wife. She had approached us for help with the orphanage at the Gala Dinner, so I said we would visit on the Monday. This was nothing like the orphanages I had been used to seeing in the past. It was new and better than some of our private schools in the UK. We decided that we will just have to look into it further in order to assess how we could help.

The next place we visited was in the next town, where the Mayor was a 41er and required a fire engine. Again, while talking I said we would try to help. However, when we got there he was very proud to show us his brand new town hall with very nice marble floors and new furniture, so priorities come to mind!

Aurel and Gheorghe were fantastic hosts to us.

Back to the UK and four days later it was time to start packing for the International Half-Yearly Meeting in India!
