INVICTA 41 CLUB'S JOLLY BOYS' OUTING

During May this year, Invicta 41 Club embarked on the first of their annual Jolly Boys' Outings. Members were encouraged to bring along sons, grandsons or guests to a boys' day out. The venue this year was Brooklands Museum in Weybridge, Surrey.



The Brooklands circuit was the brainchild of Hugh Fortescue Locke King, and was opened on 17 June 1907 as the first purpose-built banked motor race circuit in the world. The circuit hosted its last race in 1939.

The Brooklands track was built as a 100 ft, wide, 2.75 miles long, banked oval. The banking was nearly 30 feet high in places. In addition to the oval, a bisecting "finishing straight" was built, increasing the track length to 3.25 miles, of which 1.25 miles was banked. There were 1,500 men employed to build it and it could host up to 287,000 spectators at its peak.

Along the centre of the track ran a dotted black line, known as the Fifty Foot Line. By driving over the line, a driver could theoretically take the banked corners without having to use the steering wheel.

Brooklands was also one of Britain's first airfields. Roe used the site in 1908. Later Sopwith and Vickers did too. The geodotic fuselage for the Wellington bomber was developed by Barnes Wallis at Brooklands.



The site was purchased by Vickers Company after World War II. They built design offices and a wind tunnel. It was sold again in the 1980s and the aviation industry moved elsewhere.

Today it plays host to Brooklands Museum, a major aviation and motoring museum, as well as a venue for vintage car, motorcycle and other transport-related events.

We started with a brief lecture and were then allowed to explore the displays at our leisure. National President Dave Campbell wasted little time getting into the F1 simulator...

Our group was also given the opportunity to explore the interior of several aircraft including the VC10, Bleriot XI and Sopwith Camel.

The undeniable highlight of the day was 'The Concorde Experience', which not only included a tour of the aircraft but a simulated fight complete with engine roar and runway rumble. It turned old men into little boys again with all the wonder and excitement of one of Britain's real engineering marvels.

Actually, it might only be 40. Nobody can quite remember whether it was 1976 or 77 when members of Farnborough (Kent) first picked up their tents and headed off together to spend the Whitsun holiday in a field. We joined in in 1978 after transferring from Holywood but what is certain is that now, the grandchildren are bigger than our children were then – and in the case of our family, they are still using the same tent.
