

From there it's only a short leap to older men in Lycra, which makes me think of Joggling and Barry Durman. With me so far?


So "why are you telling me all this?", I hear you ask. Well it's all Barry's fault



SO, HOW DO YOU FANCY BEING A NATIONAL COUNCILLOR?

"So, how do you fancy being Region 24 National Councillor, Peter?



There was an old 'Carry On' film that I remember watching, with a scene in which there was an upright, Sergeant (probably Windsor Davies), his thin, waxed moustache rigid and the peak of his cap touching the bridge of his nose, barking orders at a row of nervous

soldiers on a parade ground, and evilly asking for a volunteer to undertake a seemingly unpopular task.

Almost immediately, the whole front row of soldiers took a step backwards, except one naïve squaddie, who looked horrifyingly to his left and right and realised he'd unknowingly been hoodwinked into volunteering.

"Well done soldier! Follow me – the rest of you are dismissed!" snapped the Sergeant.

I confess I felt a bit like that squaddie when I was encouraged to put my name forward as a nominee for Region 24's National Councillor (NC) back in April earlier this year. I'd been the target of a 'pincer-movement' (I later realised) of flattery and encouragement from numerous National Council members and long standing friends from other 41 Clubs in my Region about a month previously who had all convinced me that I'd be "perfect for the role". A role that was being vacated by my predecessor David Leach, who was about to throw his hat into the ring and go for the National Treasurer role – a role he successfully got.

Anyway, I was successful in my application and from humble beginnings within my own Club of Wallington & Carshalton in Sutton, I had now joined the hallowed

crowd of National Council ready to take my seat in the 'Ivory Castle' as National Councillor for Region 24 – SW London, Surrey and Sussex – one of the larger Regions with 40 Clubs and around 850 members. I confess I was as nervous as a long-tailed cat in a room full of rocking chairs...

To be honest, I had no idea what Clubs were in the Region nor how large it was – so how

the hell was I supposed to liaise with so many Clubs and people? Who was I supposed to contact? Would Clubs want me to visit them? And more importantly, would my wife still speak to me when I got back late again from yet another Club visit?

It was clear that over the next three years, I was going to be as busy as a one-legged man in a butt-kicking contest...

So just as singing "Let's start at the very beginning" seemed to work OK for Julie Andrews, I decided to adopt the Nike approach and 'Just Do It'.

Firstly I created a map of all the Clubs in the Region and immersed myself into the Club Administration System - or CAS as it's referred to (occasionally I referred to it as 'Momma CAS' as it was sometimes a bit of a 'Mother' to master).

I soon found out that there was a mountain of helpful information in the various systems and quickly built up a list of Region 24 Club details, contacts, meeting dates and member details.

Then it was a case of emailing and telephoning the Club contacts – my first attempt wasn't great when I managed to send out 40 identical emails to John Hollis in Aldershot 41 Club using the 'send to Mailing List' feature of CAS – he was very good about it but I'm pretty sure he thought the new Region 24 NC was about as useful as a pogo stick in quicksand... Sorry again John!

After a slow July & August (it seemed most Club contacts had all gone on holiday together somewhere or their Clubs only really regrouped after the Summer holidays) - spent introducing myself to all 40 Clubs and trying to schedule future visits, I'm now six months into the role and (whisper this, please) I'm really enjoying it.

I've notched up two National Council weekend meetings under my belt (the second meant I had to sacrifice watching my beloved Premier League team actually score a goal and win!), have visited 8 Clubs, have 19 more visits scheduled and am in contact with the remaining 13 Clubs in the Region.

In addition to his NC role, each NC is also allocated to a different committee – and as someone got wind of my IT background, I foolishly offered to join the National IT & Comms Committee led by Godwin Stewart and assist in the project to improve/replace the National CAS system. Have I learnt nothing about volunteering?

I've also learnt what you can and can't claim for – e.g. travelling mileage yes, meals no... and I felt like an apprentice when my expense claim was returned with 'virtual' red pen all over it... (OK, not really but it felt like it).

In the meantime, I've shared two excellent 30th Charter celebrations within Region 24 in the past ten days – Wimbledon Womblers and Banstead XRT. We live in an age

where pizza gets to your home before the police and with the deluge of Social Media including Facebook, Twitter and other virtual communications these days, it was great to celebrate over 400 actual, old-fashioned, real face-to-face meetings that both Clubs must have enjoyed over the past 30 years.

As it happens, Banstead XRT was

born on exactly the same evening of the great storm of 1987 and a video of that weather forecast by Michael Fish was shown to the audience.


"Why isn't Michael Fish here today then?" someone shouted out after the video. "Because he's dead!" came the reply from one of my posse from Wallington & Carshalton.
