



## School Uniform and Equipment Expectations 2019 – 2020

Please see below for the uniform expectations for the academic year September 2019 – July 2020.

### Boys

- Black Trousers or Black Shorts
- Black or White Socks
- Red Polo Shirt with or without school badge
- Red School Sweatshirt with school badge
- Option of Black Shorts for the Summer Term
- Black Leather Shoes (no trainers)

### Girls

- Black Skirt or Trousers or Black Pinafore Dress
- Black or White Socks or Black Tights
- Red Polo Shirt with or without school badge
- Red School Sweatshirt or Cardigan with school badge
- Option of Black Shorts for the Summer Term
- Black Leather Shoes (no trainers)
- Option of Red & White Dresses for the Summer Term (Easter – July)

### PE Kit – to be in school everyday

- Plain Black Shorts for indoor and outdoor work
- Red T-Shirt with or without school badge
- Black tracksuit bottoms with or without school badge for outdoor lessons.
- Alternative red sweatshirt or hoodie for outdoor lessons.
- Plimsolls for indoor lessons
- Trainers for outdoor lessons
- We strongly suggest that older children also have a change of socks for PE.
- Key Stage 2: Red Swimming Trunks (not board shorts) or Red Swimming Costume

### Waterproof Clothing – to be in school everyday

- All-in-one waterproofs or separates (jacket & trousers)
- Wellington boots

### Equipment

- A reusable water bottle to be in school every day
- A dedicated 'reading folder' for taking books to and from school.
- A small backpack big enough to hold an A4 clipboard.
- Year 5 & 6: an analogue wrist watch.

### Long Hair

- Boys **and** Girls with hair that covers their eyes or face must have it tied back or held back with a band during school hours.
- All pupils with hair long hair must have it tied back during PE lessons.

### Jewellery

- No jewellery is allowed for school with the exception of an analogue wristwatch (which we encourage) and small discreet stud earrings. These **MUST** be removed for PE by the child.

*In line with Essex County Council guidelines Earrings must be removed (by the child) for PE as they are no longer allowed to be taped over. If the child is unable to remove them they will not be able to take part in the PE lesson. We strongly recommend that the best time to have your child's ears pierced, if at all, is at the start of the long summer holiday.*
