Butser Farm Trip - report by Millicent

On the 8th of March 2018, Torberry class visited Butser Ancient Farm under our Invaders and Settlers topic.



At 10 o'clock, we arrived to

be greeted by Mark, our teacher and guide for the day.

Our first activity, or rather introduction, was in the Iron Age hut where we spoke about the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings, which was very interesting.

Our second activity was outside: to make two wattle fences out of wooden posts and hazel branches and it was girls vs boys! The girls won by making a stronger fence, even though the boys' fence was taller.

Thirdly, we were shown how to make jewellery: spiral pendants for necklaces. We made them out of wire, using pliers and our fingers, which was quite tricky.

Afterwards we ate lunch and visited the site shop, where all of us bought souvenirs of our outing; we also stretched our legs before heading back inside the hut.

Our next activity was to guess what kind of artefacts were found in a Saxon house and where, based on what we knew. Most of us did very well. Our last activity was crafting lucky pendants out of chalk, which was very difficult, but equally fun.

At two o'clock we left, but all of us enjoyed it and many wanted to come again because we all found the trip amazing.
