Coronavirus information - reminder

Nobody should be in school if they (or family members) have COVID-19 or symptoms. These include:

- Headaches
- **A temperature**
- Shortness of breath
- **Loss of smell (or taste)**
- **Persistent cough**
- Poor appetite (common in children)

The **emboldened** symptoms are those which require anyone to be tested for COVID-19 and off school. This needs to be completed within five days of onset. If anyone in a household displays these, everyone in a household should self-isolate.

We ask you to err on the side of caution, rather than come into school. 'If in doubt, don't go out!' and ring the school office to inform us. There are now a couple of useful documents on the home page, which may clarify things, should you have to consider what to do. Thank you to Lucy Crabtree for sharing these.

Please avoid giving Calpol to your child, prior to them coming into school, for any of the above symptoms as it may mask illness and risk cross-infection.

Many of you have already returned the consent forms for the children's flu vaccines. It would be helpful if the remainder could be sent back to the school office, as soon as possible, so that office staff do not need to chase you and your child does not miss this important protection.

Leaving the school site

Thank you to you all for socially-distancing and adhering to the rules. We feel that the departure of children from school is working much better, so plan to continue with the way in which we are now ending the school day. We will therefore be releasing Downlands pupils from the front entrance and Torberry children from the side entrance to the school, rather than classroom doors.

This has resulted in the Warren parents and their children being able to readily walk down the path without fear of contact. We are glad that our systems have improved, thank you for your support.

Open Afternoon

This year, for obvious reasons, we won't be having a formal open afternoon. We will, however, welcome parents to 'View through the window' the week beginning 5.10.20 (or, indeed, another day).

Our catchment area includes Harting and surrounding villages but we are often able to accommodate children from further afield, including Petersfield and other Hampshire locations.

Free School Meals

We would be grateful if you would apply for 'free school meals', should you think you're your family circumstances might match the criteria (see below), even if your child will automatically receive them along with all other 'infant pupils'. By applying, you will help the whole school budget as there is an element of it linked to this register.

Eligibility for free school meals:

- income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
