

PRIME POSITION

The property is located at the heart of Bothwell Street. Bothwell Street is considered the prime office street in Glasgow and has recently seen major office developments at 177 Bothwell Street (1), Aurora 120 Bothwell Street (2) and Lucent 50 Bothwell Street (3). The buildings have secured prime office lettings to blue-chip covenant tenants, achieving headline rental levels, in excess of £41.50.

An opportunity to create a best in class office in Glasgow's premier business district.

The property extends to a GIA of 234,845 sq ft (NIA of 174,610 sq ft) over basement, ground and eight upper floors. Typical floor plates are c.20,000 sq ft with a single row of four columns on each floor.

Serviced by 5 large passenger lifts, 2 firefighter lifts and 1 goods lift, the floor plate can be subdivided easily to offer occupiers a range of floor sizes.

Each floor offers impressive 2.8m floor-to-ceiling heights, enhanced by 1,000mm ceiling voids and 180mm raised access flooring maximising flexibility.

The property is partially let to Pinsent and Masons at an annual passing rent of £961,880, expiring in March 2026. This will enable a developer to commence works of modernisation and refurbishment to create contemporary office space and meet the requirements of today's corporate occupiers.







GLASGOW OCCUPATIONAL MARKET

Glasgow's office market demonstrated robust growth in 2024, achieving a total annual take-up of 439,367 sq ft, reflecting an increase of 42% year-on-year and exceeding the five-year average by 7%. This figure was achieved across 126 transactions, the highest annual total on record for the city and 22% above the five-year average transaction volume.

Grade A and Prime office take-up for 2024 reached 175,223 sq ft, accounting for 40% of all space transacted. This represents a 30% year-on-year increase in the combined Grade A and Prime take-up. There was a notable shift in the supply of these markets: Grade A availability decreased by 11% to 402,630 sq ft, and the vacancy rate fell to 2.7%. Conversely, Prime availability increased by 89% to stand at 224,666 sq ft, with the vacancy rate rising to 1.5%.

At the end of H1 2025, Glasgow has recorded takeup of 234,153 sq ft, positioning the market for its strongest annual performance since the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic.

Total office availability remained stable at 2.2 million sq ft compared to the previous quarter. Secondary stock constitutes 72% of current supply, while the overall vacancy rate increased slightly by 20 basis points to 14.9%. Despite the increase in Prime availability, there is a continued lack of best-inclass space to satisfy demand.


The headline rent for the market was established at £41.50 per sq ft with the letting in the Aurora Building to Pinsent Masons. Further increases in prime headline rents are anticipated through subsequent lettings.

Glasgow's office market is currently characterised by strong occupier demand for high-quality accommodation, competitive headline rents, and limited Grade A availability. Continued supply constraints in best-in-class space are expected to support further rental growth.


