


Since 2011, Soapworks' development on the site of the old Colgate Palmolive Factory has transformed the Ordsall Riverside area from a dilapidated, underused semi-industrial corridor into a sustainable commercial area, concentrated on being as socially conscious as it is environmentally friendly.

Soapworks' hands-on, adaptive approach to ESG means we consistently set the standard for community building in the ever-changing workplace. The efficacy and authenticity of our policies and practices are under constant review to ensure our wider responsibilities are not only met but exceeded.





ENCOURAGING ENGAGEMENT FOR A GREENER FUTURE



COMMUNITY ALLOTMENT SCHEME

- » 2 years on, the community allotment is thriving, pushing out multiple harvests per year
- » Tenants take home what they grow
- » The Soapworks Team grows produce for the FOODWORKS cafe



ENERGY UPGRADE

- » Bespoke energy monitoring system created to digitise hundreds of submeters & give granular detail via online portal
- » Surfacing live meter data has enabled tenants to spot and reduce wasted usage

SUSTAINABLE UMBRELLA HIRE

- » Bespoke reusable rentable umbrellas
- » Every rental plants a tree - 150+ planted so far
- » Works alongside the NGO, Eden Reforestation Project
- » Each umbrella contains 5 recycled plastic bottles



INCENTIVE SCHEMES

- » Repeating 20p discount for bringing sustainable crockery
- » Free, branded reusable travel mug made of recycled plastics on their 9th coffee



SOLAR ENERGY

In an effort to reduce carbon output and save the building and its tenants money, the landlord pre-funded the installation of solar panels across the entirety of the Soapworks Roof.

1.5 years post-install, the site has seen a significant reduction in the quantity of units being brought in via national grid.

- » 776 PV panels installed
- » Preventing 58,467 KG Carbon from being released per year
- » 300,000 kW/h production per year, equivalent to approx. 1.5 months of electric site-wide
- » Electricity saving of approximately £100,000 per annum post pay-back
- » Solar Edge inverters installed to capitalise on most yield throughout the day
- » In its first eight months, the energy saved is equivalent to planting 2,728 trees
- » During summer months, the solar is capable of powering the entire site at weekends



Officially awarded the rating of EPC A in mid-2025



Solar Panel installation: Soapworks takes the need for clean energy seriously, and what better way to ensure sustainable energy than bringing it in house! A massive 776 panels now fill the entire roof.



Full LED lighting upgrade: 1,026 fluorescent bulbs swapped out, reducing energy usage across site by 75%. That's thousands of pounds in savings, and tens of thousands of units to be saved in the near future.



FUTURE-PROOFED INVESTMENTS

On-site Waste and Recycling Centre

- » Going above and beyond segregating waste pre-collection to maximise recycling
- » Each tenant is provided monthly statistics and advice on how to reduce waste and improve efficiency
- » Programme of working with tenants to make measurable improvements
- » Waste streams include Dry Mixed Recycling, Cardboard, General, Food and Glass
- » Coffee grounds plant fertiliser scheme from Foodworks
- » Annual recycling game for tenants, to improve understanding of commercial waste and reduce contamination of recycling

Energy Management

- » Helping tenants deep dive into their consumption and make strategic adjustments to their plant & equipment, using the upgraded energy platform from University of Lancaster
- » Live energy monitoring accessible via portal 24/7
- » Annual energy efficiency review
- » Ongoing conversion to LED lighting

SOCIAL INTEGRATION AN INCLUSIVE CULTURE

Community

- » The Soapworks scheme was designed to open up the local area, reconnecting the residents with the River Irwell
- » Constantly evolving community events calendar, ranging from an 'I'm a Celebrity, Get Me Out of Here' challenge to a Halloween Pumpkin Patch, encouraging a fun and diverse workspace
- » Regularly supporting local businesses and charities through collaborations, donations and volunteering.
- » On-site chef creating fresh, delicious food, accommodating all dietary needs
- » Regular pop-up stalls featuring food from all over the world; Pho, Bao buns, Tex Mex, Roast dinners...
- » Dog friendly
- » Community initiatives such as litter picking

Community Spaces

- » Free Fruit Fridays





DEFIBRILLATION DONATION

A 15-year-old local boy with an undiagnosed heart condition had a heart attack in the street. His heart stopped but luckily, he was revived by an off-duty paramedic nearby.

Now living with the condition, Blake's heart could stop at any time. Soapworks did what little we could and refurbished an unused Defibrillator for the family to keep in the home for the worst-case scenario.



SALFORD LADS & GIRLS' CLUB PARTNERSHIP



Salford Lads and Girl's Club is a backbone for the youth of our area. They provide free activities, clubs and support for young people, as well as being an iconic music landmark for bands like The Smiths.


Due to the building's age, the institution launched an urgent appeal to raise £250,000 or they would be forced to close.


We're thrilled that our £2,000 donation helped them reach this target, along with other large donations from The Smiths and Salford Council.



After our initial donation, we discovered that the club had a wish list of essential supplies needed to continue the kids clubs and update worn-out equipment.

We donated hundreds of pounds of colouring supplies, boxing gloves, badminton kits, sanitary products, and technology to ensure they could keep doing their good work.





OUR CHARITIES

- » Soapworks cherishes the charities closest to our site: Salford Food Bank, the iconic Lads and Girls club, Ordsall local football team and much more...
- » Donate all unsold food from FOODWORKS cafe to the Friday night Don't Walk Past pop up, a small but mighty organisation, who take it straight out to feed Manchester's homeless community
- » Seasonal donation drives so our tenants can get hands on with Don't Walk Past and Salford Foodbank, which has seen a 50% increase in demand since 2022
- » Host regular awareness stalls for charities to engage their local community, including Men's Mental Health, Suicide Prevention,
- » Donate over 1000 items every year, from tents to interview clothing
- » Charity fundraising with seasonal raffles etc, used to buy supplies and urgent items for Foodbank & youth club



