

Description

This end-terraced two-storey industrial unit offers a great mix of workspace and living accommodation. Built with a steel portal frame and full-height brick elevations, the property includes two floors of space with offices at the front and a pitched roof overhead.

Inside, the main warehouse area features a solid concrete floor, three-phase electricity, strip lighting, a mezzanine level, and separate WC facilities.

The first-floor offices have been converted into a five-bedroom apartment, finished with oak flooring, gas central heating, double-glazed aluminium windows, a kitchen area, and additional WC facilities.
