Christmas Activity for Children



C-H-R-I-S-T-M-A-S

This is suitable for a service in school or at the beginning of a service in a church or chapel. Children make cards or placards with the letters of Christmas on the front and the sentence on the back so they can read them.

The children can wear costumes of some kind if you wish - they can be dressed as angels or else wear tabards in suitable colours such as red and green. These could be made out of crepe paper. At the beginning of the service, the children walk up to the front with the minister or teacher and stand in a line facing those present. In turn, the children put up their letters and recite the appropriate sentence.

H is for **Holly** and for the **Hope** that Jesus brought

R is for **Rejoicing** at this time of the year

I is for Indigestion from eating too much!

S is for the bright Star that led the wise men to worship

T is for Tinsel and Turkey and Toys

A is for Angels who sang sweetly in the sky

S is for **Silent Night** which we're going to sing now:

Everyone sings Silent Night
