 Management to inspect the disused Workhouse
 premises at Glin and to confer with them in
 regard to the alterations necessary to render
 the premises suitable for the purpose for
 which they are required.

Inspector have arranged to visit Glin on Tuesday the 30th Inst. for the purpose of conferring with a Committee appointed by the Board of Management of the Glin District School with regard to the alterations to be made in the disused Workhouse premises at Glin for the purpose of rendering them suitable for the purpose of a school.

On the motion of Mr. R. J. Gabbett seconded by Mr. M. Fitzgerald the following Report of the View Committee was adopted:

" The Committee appointed by the Board of Management of the Glin District School, visited on the 30th Ult. at Glin, the buildings lately used as the Glin Union Workhouse. They were accompanied by Mr. E. Bourke, L. G. B. and Mr. O'Brien Smyth, Engineering Inspector of Local Government Board, who brought the official maps of the Workhouse buildings and

and ably assisted them with his advice.

The main result of the inspection is that the Committee consider the premises are admirably suited to the purposes for which it is now proposed to use them, namely, an Industrial School for the children of the six Unions that form the District.

Appended to this Report will be found tabulated statements, shewing the size of most of the rooms in the existing buildings, the purposes to which the Committee suggest that these several rooms should be devoted, and the probable number that can be accommodated in each room, and it is hoped that with the help of the plans of the buildings, which Mr. Bourke will produce at this meeting, that the Board of Management will find no difficulty in understanding these tables.

The Committee, being of opinion that the existing buildings, together with certain additional ones to be alluded to subsequently, will only be large enough to accommodate somewhat over 300 children, strongly recommend, that, when the District School is first opened, only those children that

that have attained the age of seven years should be sent to it.

The additions, alterations, repairs &c. that the committee venture to recommend, and for which plans & specifications will have to be invited from competent architects, are as follows:

I New Buildings:

(a) A chapel about 75 feet long, by 25 feet wide to be erected beyond the Dining Hall, between the two main yards with a side-door opening into each yard, and connected with the Dining Hall by a porch.

(b) A scullery to be built on the left side of the present kitchen.

(c) A small separate scullery for the use of the Sisters of Mercy who may be entrusted with the teaching of the female children.

It may subsequently be found necessary to erect two workshops for the boys classes, but the committee are of opinion that this need not be done at present.

II Alterations:

(a) The conversion of certain portions of the front building

building into apartments suitable for the Sisters of Mercy.

(b) Of the buildings lately used as old clothes stores into lavatories.

(c) Of the room lately used as a chapel into a portion of the Dining Hall.

III Repairs:

The committee recommend that all existing brick-floors in rooms to be used as dormitories or class rooms, be boarded over the bricks.

That general repairs to plastering, slating, and woodwork be executed where necessary, that all external woodwork be re-painted and internal woodwork, wherever required.

That the Laundry and Bake-house be put into thorough repair and fitted with the necessary appliances.

That the lavatories be fitted up with baths supplied with cold and hot water, and that also a place for washing purposes be set apart in each block of buildings to be used as dormitories.

The committee also suggest, that the yard lately used as a Female Infirmary yard, be altered

to the Sisters of Mercy for their use as a private garden.

Finally, the Committee strongly urge the Board of Management to instruct their Architect to fully examine into and report to them on the condition of the water supply and sewerage of the Institution.

Mr. Nunan (a member of the Committee) that visited the late Glin Workhouse, having read a report moved that it be adopted as the report of the Committee, but the proposition not having been seconded the matter fell through.

THE TEACHERS.—LETTER FROM THE MOST REV.
DR. O'DWYER.

The following was read:

"The Palace, Corbally,
Limerick, 29th July, '93.

"Dear Sir,—I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 24th instant, and to request you to have the kindness to convey to your Board my very high sense of the interest which they show in the moral and religious education of the children under their charge by the desire which they express of putting them under the care of religious teachers, and I would presume to offer a very special acknowledgment to the Protestant members of the Board for the liberal spirit in which they have joined their Catholic fellow-members in the matter.

"In reply to your inquiry I have to state that the Sisters of Mercy will be prepared to take charge of the girls and infants. It would be of great importance in the care of the boys if we could secure the services of the Christian Brothers. They are so successful as teachers, and I have now so large a number of their boys trained in the system of their Industrial School that it would be of immense advantage not only for the moral and religious interests of the children, but for the efficient and economical working out of the important experiment in which we are engaged if we had the good fortune to obtain their co-operation.

"There is, however, as the Guardians are aware a difficulty between them and the Board of National Education; but I think that a resolution of your Board expressing a desire to have the aid of these excellent teachers in inaugurating a most important movement of workhouse reforms would go far to remove it.

"It might be pointed out that the school at Glin will not be a mere ordinary day school, but a boarding school—that the children will be all, without one exception—of one religion—that as it will resemble in character it ought to follow the rules of the Industrial School, and its teachers if they are to do their duty by the poor children must stand to them in *loco parentis*, and teach them religion and train them in its exercise if they are not to become a pest to society.

the water has remained at the pretty constant level of 13 feet from the bottom.

The dimensions of the Well in the Female yard are similar. The water from this Well was pronounced unsatisfactory at the recent analysis as containing a large amount of nitrogenous matter. This can to a large extent be accounted for by the facts that the Well has not been used for over a quarter of a century, and the pump stick found in it was quite rotten. A thorough cleaning up and relining in cement concrete is absolutely essential for both Wells.

It is satisfactory to find on testing that there is no connection between the Springs supplying the Wells.

On account of the proximity of sewers and cesspools to guard against sewerage percolation the linings (rising from the bottom of Wells to ground surface) must be impervious to water. Juggler holes

or a 4" boring can then be carried to such depth as may be found necessary to sufficiently strengthen the springs.

We are of opinion that it would be more satisfactory to have those works executed by your Engineers, with the trained staff they have at present carrying out Union works in the West of the County.

We estimate the cost of removing present lining, excavating, cleaning and relining present Wells at £25.0.0 each.

A new force and lift pump, connected with new Cistern on Water tower will have to be provided and the present pump can be fixed in the other Well.

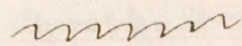

they consider would be the most suitable

the Sisters of Mercy. The next apartment

is 16.6" x 15.0 being the turn reception
room. then a Refectory same size and then
a commodious kitchen 19.0 x 21.0 fitted up with
an excellent cooking range and boiler which
supplies the means of heating the rooms upstairs
by hot water pipes along the passage. On the
upper story were the waterclosets and Lavatory
with bath. then the infirmary, cell and in
succession 8 other cells. The small apartment at
further end being too small for an Oratory
as originally intended is recommended to be used as
a storeroom and the end apartment over the
Clerk's office is asked for by the Sisters as a
community room, its size is 22.6 x 13.0.

The Committee then inspected the new covered
passage from the range to the Chapel. It is
commodious and light some, but they strongly
recommend the timber and metal work to be
well primed with several coats of paint. The
timber being of white deal. The roof of the
Chapel was being lathed and plastered. The
water supply next engaged attention and it

is recommended that the rain water off the roofs be utilized. The hot water steaming apparatus was erected by Messrs Barford and Perkins and the connections and fittings in the kitchen were being executed - Proceeding down the other ranges of buildings for the male and female class rooms and dormitories the proposed alterations have been carried out and the lavatories on the female side almost completed. Arising out of this the sewerage system of the entire institution shall require immediate assention of the Board. also the making of an entrance on either side to facilitate the delivery of the coal to the large boiler. also the erection of a shed to receive the supply of coal.

"On the 11<sup>th</sup> instant the gentlemen deputed by your Board met three of the Christian Brothers at Elin for the purpose of inspecting the school buildings there. The gentlemen present were P. O'Shaughnessy Esq and your Engineers Messrs Hartigan and Leahy and Brothers Whitty, Brophy and O'Brien.

A Report on the accommodation afforded and the alterations considered necessary by the Brothers, with sketch plans showing same was drawn up by Brother Whitty and posted to you as Chairman on the 13<sup>th</sup> instant. But it now seems this Report unfortunately never reached your hands.

Briefly the points of the Report were:-

- (1.) - The existing buildings would give dormitory accommodation for about 162 boys.
- (2.) - Also school accommodation for the same number.
- (3.) - The lavaine accommodation provided for this number was wholly insufficient.
- (4.) - The lavatory arrangements for the dormitories in the rear range of buildings were inadequate and would have to be increased.
- (5.) - The arrangements for the Brothers in the past destined for their residence would need some changes and improvements. It was only natural to expect that these changes would have to be made as the Brothers had never been consulted before as to what they would require - However, what the Brothers now suggest is what they consider barely necessary, and it will not involve any considerable outlay on the part of the Board.

The alterations for increasing the lavatory accommodation in the rear buildings are shown on the plans handed in herewith. The plans of Boys' closets and urinals and the alterations

suggested in the portion of the buildings intended for the Brothers' residence are also shown

- (6) - That a bake house be fitted up with an oven and the other necessary requirements of a bakery

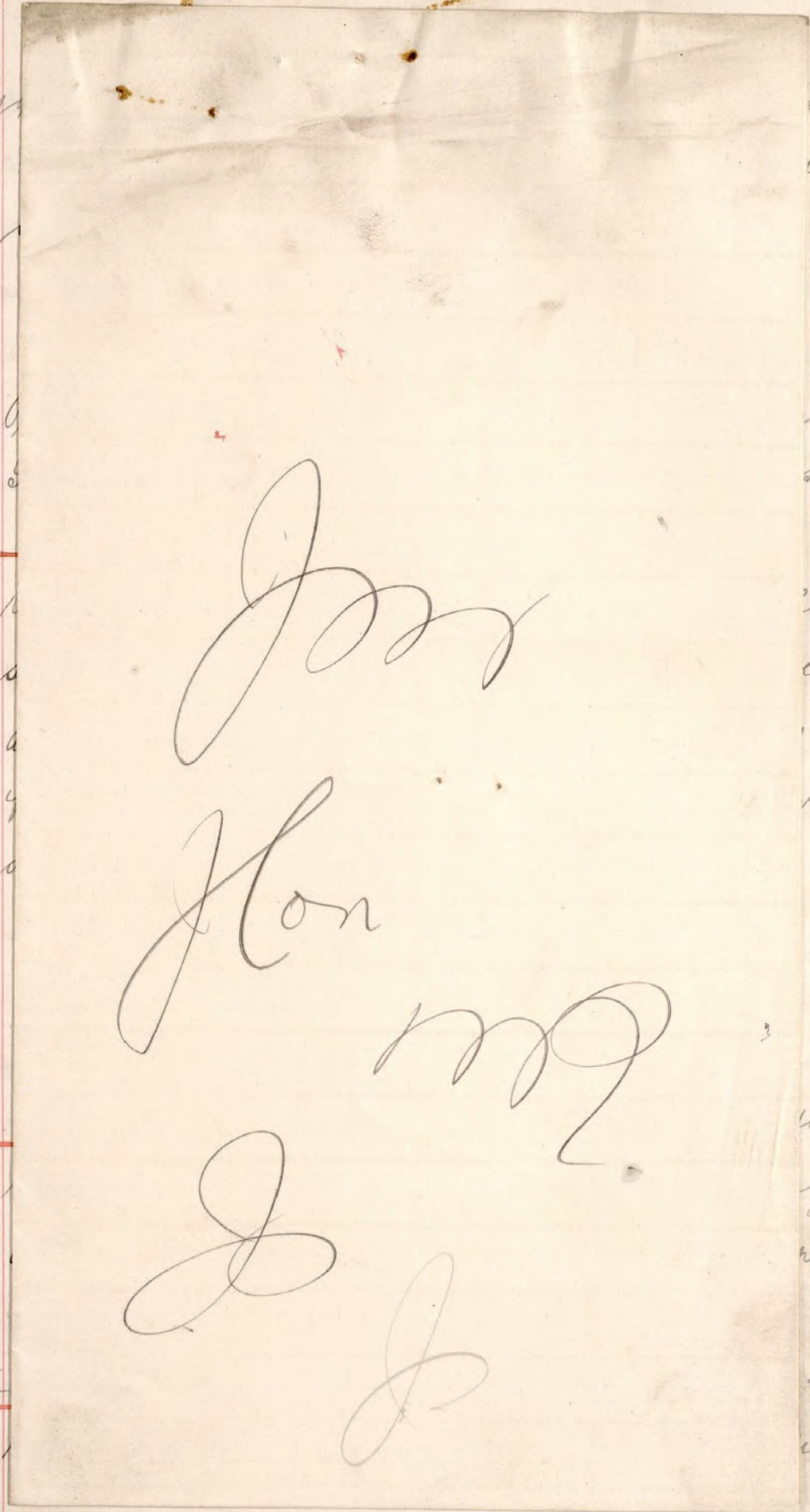

with. The waters of both wells have recently been analysed by Sir Charles Cameron and his report has been laid before you stating that both are moderate waters. Previously, a system of cesspools in connection with the closets and also two dry gullested drains from the kitchen and Laundry thro the yards were in use.

The drains discharged into ^{the} open field in front of the Institution and the cesspools were cleaned out from time to time. There was danger of pollution to the well waters from these sources by percolation thro the adjacent sub-soil which for a depth of 11 feet from the ground level to the underlying rock is of a gravelly, porous nature. Now, however, that the Board has adopted a complete system of sewerage that the cesspools are to be disused and having lined the well in the Female yard which was always unsatisfactory we consider those dangers of percolation to the well waters removed."

 "The Local Government Board have been unable to approve of this arrangement, the duties appertaining to the two positions being quite distinct and separate, and it would neither be practicable or in accordance with the law to appoint the same person to act in both capacities.  
 One of the most important duties devolving on the Clerk will be that of periodically checking and balancing the books and accounts of the Master and Medical Officer. This is an essential part of the system of audit prescribed by the Board's rules, and without it errors and complications in the accounts might occur which it would be difficult to adjust at the half yearly audit.  
 "It is obvious the Master's books cannot properly be checked by the Master himself, and the Board are satisfied that the working of the establishment at the commencement will be facilitated by having a trained and experienced official in the position of Clerk to whom the Christian Brothers will be able to refer for advice and assistance upon any question of accounts or procedure which may appear to present a difficulty.  
 "It is possible that Mr Guinane may ultimately find that the duties of the Office are more than he is able to undertake, but for the present, at all events, it is to be hoped that if possible he will continue to act.  
 "The Local Government Board desire to add that apart from the obstacles to the amalgamation of these two Offices above referred to, they think it will be found that the duties and responsibilities of managing this large establishment and the keeping of the diet, clothing, and maintenance accounts, in addition to the duties of Head Teacher, will be quite as much as any one person could reasonably be expected to perform.

"SIR—The Local Government Board for Ireland have had under consideration the proposal of the Board of Management of Glin District Poor Law School to appoint six Christian Brothers as teachers in the boys' school—namely, Wm N O'Shea, Francis Gallagher, James M'Conville, Cornelius Moran, Matthew O'Donnell, and Joseph Ring. The Board have also had before them the resolution of the Board of Management of the 8th September, in which an undertaking is given that separate arrangements will be made for the maintenance and education of any Protestant children who may be sent to Glin by the guardians of the contributory unions.  
"I am directed to state that upon this distinct assurance, and upon the understanding that the school is to be open to pauper children of all religious denominations, the Board are willing to assent to the proposal of the Board of Management, and they will be prepared to sanction the payment of a Protestant teacher, should the necessity arise in consequence of the admission of Protestant children.  
The Board have received satisfactory replies to the queries submitted by them to the Christian Brothers, and they have also received an assurance that the Christian Brothers will conform to all the regulations of the Local Government Board. Under these circumstances the appointments are approved, and the salaries exclusive of allowance, in lieu of rations will be recouped from the Parliamentary grant, except in the case of the Head Teacher. As this gentleman is also master of the establishment' recoupment of £50 can only be allowed in his case, that being the portion of his salary which may be regarded as payable to him in respect of his duties as head teacher. I am to point out that under article 27 of the General Regulations the master of the school must be required to give a bond in such penal sum as the Board of Management think fit, for the due and faithful performance of his duties, and I am to request that the Board of Management will decide the amount of security to be given at their next meeting—Your obedient servant,

Mr Thompson has not come to remedy these defects since last meeting held at Limerick, on 1st Instant altho then ordered to do so. It leaked in several places when heat was put on during our visit.

The brick work over range in kitchen here shows want of proper care in setting. The Engineers should be ordered to remedy these defects at expense of Contractor if he does not do so at once.

Get Specification from Engineers for next meeting for plain forms - Special seats for Christian Brothers. Engineers to consult Nuns and Christian Brothers for seats and presses.

Clerk's Office and Board Room. Chairs and table required for this.

Water. We fear the supply of water at present available will not be sufficient for this Institution. We have been informed that a good spring can be easily obtained in field at east or Nuns side and we think a pump should be sunk there to increase the supply of water.

All the available old boilers have been put under down pipes to receive and hold water. If more of these could be procured at cheap price we recommend to put up some more, as the class of water thus obtained is best for laundry purposes.

Postponed.

Mr O'Malley has not yet completed his contract. He appears to us to be an unsatisfactory contractor. The Engineers ought to be ordered to complete his contract at his expense if he does not do so forthwith.

Clerk to communicate with Mr O'Malley on same lines as in the case of Mr Thompson.

Caretaker. The old caretaker has given up keys and removed his cattle.

The present caretaker, Maurice Fitzgerald, seems to be doing his work in an excellent manner. With respect to charges alleged against him at last meeting in Limerick he has shown us excellent characters from

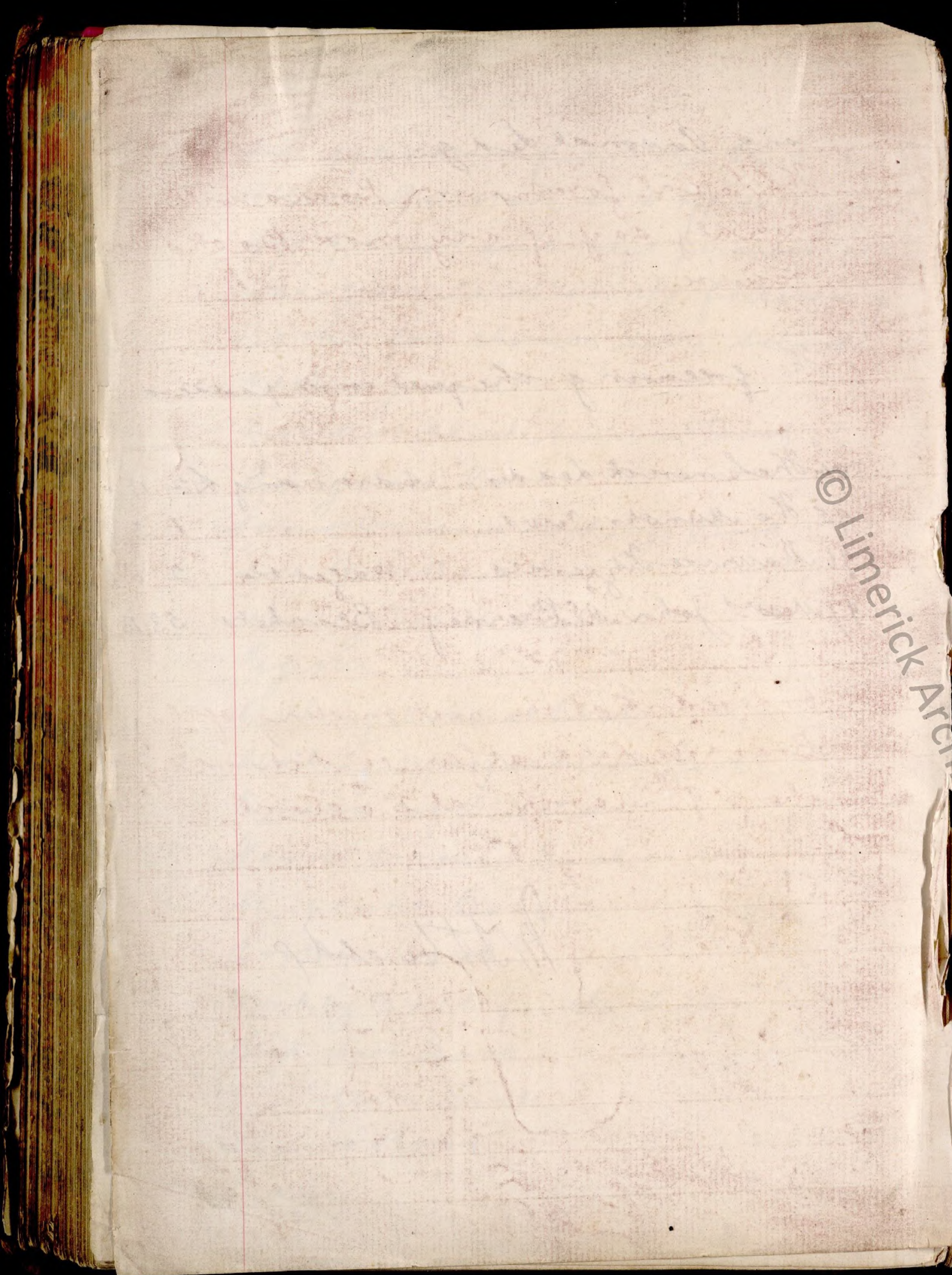
