1. I have the honour to report that I have audited the accounts of the Corporation of Limerick for the three years ended at 31st March, 1943. Certified abstracts of these accounts are transmitted herewith.

3. These totals, which take account of transfers, include Receipts and Payments on the Gas Works and Public Assistance Departments.

4. In accordance with the requirements of Article 31 of the Public Bodies Order, 1942, the accounts of the year ended 31st March, 1943, are compiled on a Receipts and Expenditure basis.

There were net credit balances of £19252 19s. 5d. and £11,389 4s. 4d. on the Municipal Fund (excluding Gas Works A/c.) at 31st March, 1941, and 1942, respectively, and a debit balance of £6,499 10s. 5d. at 31st March, 1943. This latter balance was ascertained after the inclusion of £10,448 17s. 8d., outstanding bills, in the expenditure before adjusting the Bank Balance at 31st March, 1943.

8. Rates collectable in respect of the three years under audit totalled £121,227 19s. 0d., £122,221 7s. 11d. and £126,242 14s. 0d. (including arrears of rates at the commencement of the year in each case) respectively, and rates actually collected amounted to £91,010 2s. 4d., £92,608 19s. 0d. and £96,749 6s. 4d., representing (together with discounts allowed) a collection of 75.62% for 1940-41, 76.29% for 1941-42 and 77.15% for 1942-43.

9. Arrears of Rates outstanding at 31st March, 1941, 1942 and 1943 totalled £27,310 8s. 5d. £27,374 7s. 8d. and £26,966 8s. 4d. respectively.

10. Arrears of rents on Artizans' Dwellings increased from £919 17s. 9d. at 31st March, 1940, to £2,567 13s. 5d. at 31st March, 1943. In the same period, the number of lettings had increased from 1,175 to 1,607.

11. The requirements of Articles 32, 43, and 98 of the Public Bodies Order, 1942, have not been put into operation yet. Some progress has been made in an effort to comply with Article 32, and I understand the City Manager has applied under Article 105 for exemption from regulations contained in Article 98.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT.

12. Payments made out of Capital Account in respect of the three years under review totalled £170,904 13s. 7d., £154,838 7s. 9d. and £88,703 10s. 1d. respectively. Payments relating to Employment Relief Grant Works are included in these totals. Whilst this is so, the great bulk of this expenditure (£142,481 in 1940-41, £121,650 in 1941-42, and £65,044 in 1942-43) relate to building operations especially on the Killeely and Prospect Schemes.

13. In order to continue the construction of houses during the emergency, the City Manager had to solve two difficulties: (1) the procurement of builders' materials and supplies in sufficient quantities, and (2) the elimination of fluctuations of prices of these articles which would have the effect of increasing the all-in cost of each house. He solved these difficulties by purchasing materials and supplies in advance of building operations, and, afterwards, when these were handed over and fixed in the houses, he deducted the cost thereof from the amount due to each Contractor under the terms of his contract. Whilst this system was irregular, its adoption would appear to be the only solution to the very difficult problem of continuing the Corporation's Housing plans during the emergency.

GAS DEPARTMENT.

14. For the year ended 31st March, 1941, the accounts of the Gas Undertaking show a profit of £6,374 6s. 10d., adjusted to £5,930 10s 8d for purposes of comparison. This represents the highest figure of profit attained by the Undertaking since 1926. In respect of the two succeeding years (1941-42 and 1942-43), losses of £8,773 18s. 3d. and £6,657 11s. 6d. respectively, are recorded.

15. The following are some of the more likely causes which operated to produce unfavourable trading results in the years 1941-42 and 1942-43 compared with the large amount of profit made in the first year under audit:—

- (1) Restriction of supply of gas coal and the substitution in the retorts of slurry, duff, turf and timber with inferior carbonization results and reduced output of Residual Products.
- (2) Higher prices for coals in 1941-42 compared with 1940-41. In 1942-43, the annual average price of gas coal had not increased, as will be seen from the following comparison of annual average prices of fuels:—

- (3) The time lag in adjusting slot meters to each increase in the price of gas.

16. During the three years under review, the only contracts which operated for the supply of Yorkshire Gas Coal were the 1939-40 and

the 1940-41 contracts. Under the first of these, two cargoes were received in March and April, 1940, and under the second contract, six cargoes were received up to November, 1940. Although this latter contract was not completed in November, 1940, or at any time subsequently, no further supplies could be procured under it owing to the prohibition on the export of Yorkshire Gas Coal by the British Authorities. From that date forward all purchases of consignments of gas coal (excluding slurry and duff) were effected either on the advice of, or under arrangements made by, the Department of Supplies.

17. There are over 6,000 slot meters in use in the city, and the number of readings, and corresponding collections, from these meters in the year ended 31st March, 1943, was 28,554. These figures show the necessity for a systematic inspection and adequate check of readings of meters made by the Collectors. Without such a system of inspection and check the examination of Slot Meter Collections at audit would be of little use.

18. Prior to September, 1939, this duty was performed by the Chief Collector (Mr. Barry) who at that time was able to make an average of from 20 to 30 checkings each day on five days a week in addition to performing office work at the Gas Works.

19. In 1940, the two positions of Chief Clerk and Chief Inspector were amalgamated, and Mr. Barry was appointed to the dual post. Since taking up duty in that capacity, Mr. Barry never made more than one inspection a week during which he used to check an average of about 10 meters, and in the period from February, 1943, to the date of audit no inspections were made at all.

20. Owing to the fact that slot meters required to be regulated at the prevailing price per cubic foot of gas, losses are inevitable during a period such as that covered by the audit when six increases in the price of gas were made. The unavoidable delay involved in adjusting over 6,000 meters to the increased price results in gas continuing to be sold at the former and lower price per cubic foot. On the other hand, any losses occasioned in this way are offset later on by corresponding gains when the price of gas is reduced. It is not possible to say with any degree of accuracy what loss or gain would be produced in this way following upward or downward movements of prices of gas.

21. Particulars of the increases in the price of gas, referred to in the preceding paragraph, are set out in the following statement:—

22. In the Balance Sheet of such a large concern one would naturally expect to find the Asset 'Land, Buildings, and Manufacturing Plant' entered at a necessarily high figure. The only Fixed Asset relating to Manufacture which appears in the Balance Sheet is the Asset 'New Plant' the cost of which is set down at £23,430 11s. 3d. This requires some explanation. Prior to the year 1922 no attempt was made to differentiate between Revenue and Capital Expenditure in the accounts of the Undertaking with the result that all outlay on Buildings and Manufacturing Plant was charged to Revenue. The Corporation was not bound by the statutory forms of account prescribed by the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, and evidently elected to compile its accounts on a purely Revenue basis. This system was

changed in 1922, and since then Revenue and Capital Expenditure have been differentiated to the extent that outlay on new Plant has been capitalized but expenditure on the laying of mains and services pipes in the distribution system has continued to be a Revenue charge.

23. The result of all this has been that, instead of representing the accumulated Capital outlay on Fixed Assets over the period of 65 years during which the concern has been the property of the Corporation, the valuation of £23,430 11s. 3d. on the item "New Plant" in the Balance Sheet merely represents the cost of New Plant purchased in the period 1922-43.

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE SECTION.

24. The total net payments by way of Home Assistance for the years ended 31st March, 1941, 1942 and 1943 were £6,948 7s. 8d., £8,019 0s. 3d. and £8,771 7s. 2d. respectively, and the weekly average costs of maintenance and treatment of each person in the City Home and Hospital were 22/4d in 1940-41, 22/- in 1941-42 and 25/8d. in 1942-43.

25. I am indebted to the staff of the Corporation for the assistance afforded me in the course of a tedious and difficult audit.

26. The office accommodation at the Town Hall is so restricted that it is almost impossible to conduct an audit there. The audit just completed took about twice the length of time to complete that it would have if proper accommodation had been available.
