Presentation of the Freedom of the City of Limerick to President deValera, and Alderman Mrs. Thomas Clarke, F.R.S., at the Theatre Royal, Limerick, on Monday the 5th day of December, 1921.

P R O G R A M M E

Members of the Borough Council (except the Mayor) and distinguished guests etc to take their seats on the stage of the Theatre before the Drop Scenery is set.

Councillor Paul O'Brien to act as Marshal on the Stage.

Mayor, and Residents of President and Tom Clark, accompanied by the Lord Mayor and his suite-at-lace (in full regalia) to proceed to their seats.

1st Item on Agenda- Roll Call.

2nd " " Chairman to explain re absent Members and to call on the Town Clerk to state the business.

3rd " " Town Clerk to read Minutes concerning the Freedom, and let item on the Agenda for this Council Meeting.

4th " " The Mayor's Speech - reasons for granting the Freedom etc etc.

5th " " The Mayor to be supported by speeches from Councillor A. J. O'Brien (Lord Mayor), Councillor James Hennessy, and Councillor John Cronin.

6th " " Certificates to be read in the Irish language by the Mayor, and in English by the Town Clerk.

7th " " Certificates and Caskets to be then presented to the President and Mrs. Clarke by the Mayor, and Mrs. Clarke.

8th " " Roll of Freemen to be signed by the President and Mrs. Clarke.

9th " " The President and Mrs. Clarke to reply.

10th " " The Town Clerk to call on Mayor to dissolve the Council Meeting and resolve into a Public Meeting.

11th " " The Mayor to call on the different bodies who wish to present addresses of welcome and make presentations, to come forward.

Addresses will be taken in the following order, viz:-

- B...Sinn Féin Executive.
- C...The Gaelic League.
- D...The United Trades & Labour Council.
- E...The G.A. Association.
- F...The Faience.

County Borough Council of Limerick

BE IT REMEMBERED that at a Special Meeting of the County Borough Council of Limerick held in the Theatre Royal on Monday, the fifth day of December in the 6th year of the Republic, Alderman Maize O'Donovan, Deputy-Mayor, Presiding, the Honorary Freedom of the City was presented to Seamus deValera, President of the Irish Republic, as a protest against the aggression of England on our National and individual rights and in recognition of the President's distinguished services to the Republic in peace and war.

Given at the Theatre Royal, Henry Street, Limerick, this 5th day of December in the Year of the Republic.

BE IT REMEMBERED that at a Special Meeting of the County Borough Council of Limerick held on Monday the 5th day of December in the 6th year of the Republic, Alderman Maize O'Donovan, Deputy-Mayor, presiding, the Honorary Freedom of the City of Limerick was presented to Alderman Mrs. Thomas Clarke, Widow of Thomas J. Clarke who died for Ireland in 1916 as typifying the fearless loyalty of Irishmen to the Republic and in recognition of her services and sufferings in the National Cause.
