Limerick City Police Force.

Meeting of Sub-Committee was held in the Chamber of Commerce on Friday morning, 12th May, 1922, at the hour of 11 o'clock.

There were present- The Deputy-Mayor, Councillor Paul O'Brien.

Doctor Fogerty, Mr.M.D.Shaw, Mr.Geo.R.Ryan, and Mr.G.E.Godbody. Mr.P.T.Conlan, Asst.Town Clerk, acted as Secretary.

The Pay Sheet for the new Force for a period of three days, from Tuesday to Thursday, 11th May, inclusive was submitted amounting to £60.14. 3, and a cheque for the amount of same was authorised after examination of the various amounts. It was reported that Mr.Costeloe's name, Chief of Police, did not appear on the Sheet, and the Deputy-Mayor explained that he (Mr.Costeloe) would not accept payment for his services, but could be compensated in some other way.

A List of Bills was also submitted as certified by the Chief of Police the total amount of same being £35.11/- for supply of Armlets, Leather-belts, Holsters, and Automatic Pistols. These were passed for payment.

Mr.Costeloe who was present made a report on the hours of duty etc of the Force. He stated there were always 16 men on the Streets day and night, except for a couple of hours in the early morning, but he would arrange with his men to take in this time also.

He had now received authority from the Borough Council to utilise the City Court House as Headquarters, as the Town Hall was not suitable, and at his request the Deputy-Mayor undertook to arrange about some Bedding and the instalment of a Telephone service there. Mr.Costeloe was asked to submit a weekly report of the work done. Authority was granted to Mr.Costeloe to purchase an extra half-dozen Revolvers so that the greater part of the Force may be armed, and the Treasurers (Messrs.Shaw & Fogerty) were instructed to issue a cheque for the cost of same.

A Discussion took place as to the powers-of-arrest of the Force. It was suggested that the men should be sworn-in for such time

as the employment lasts. In this respect Mr. Costeloe stated he held a Commission from Dail Eireann and could use this authority for swearing-in his men. Subsequently Mr. Dundon, The Law Agent to the Corporation was called before the meeting for his advice in the matter. He said it was difficult to legalize the powers-of-arrest as there was no Act of Parliament to support such.

The Resolution passed at the Meeting of Traders and Merchants authorising the establishment of the Force, and the appointment of this Sub-Committee was read. Mr. Dundon advised leaving the matter stand as it is as it was improbable that the powers of the Force would be questioned. Mr. Costeloe had the necessary authority to Establish the Force under his Commission from An Dail and this Committee were only supplying him with the necessary monies to maintain it.

The Committee next took up the question of assessing the local Merchants, Traders etc., on the basis of Rateable Valuation.

As directed at last meeting the Secretary submitted a list of the Traders contained in the Telephone Director and their respective Valuations as extracted from the Official Valuation Books at the Town Hall. After due consideration the Committee adopted the following basis of assessment as suggested by Mr. Geo. R. Ryan, viz:-

Where the Rateable Valuation is £300 and over- Subscription £50.

.. .. ..	..	is £200 to £300 -	..	£30.
.. .. ..	..	is £100 to £200 -	..	£15.
.. .. ..	..	is £50 to £100 -	..	£7.10. 0
.. .. ..	..	is under £50-----	..	£2.10. 0.

It was estimated that this basis would produce over £2000 for the maintenance of the Force.

The Secretary was directed to compile lists from that submitted on this basis for next meeting, which was fixed for Monday, 15th May, at 11 o'clock.

A Meeting of sub-Committee was held in the Chamber of Commerce, on Monday, 15th day of May, 1922, at the hour of 11 o'clock a.m.

There were present- The Deputy-Mayor, Cr.Paul A.O'Brien, presiding: Mr.Malcolm D.Shaw, Mr.Geo.R.Ryan, Mr.Jos.O'Connell, and Dr.Fogerty. With the Asst.Town Clerk, Mr.P.T.Conlan, who acted as Secretary.

The Minutes of the last Meeting held on the 12th May were read, confirmed and signed.

Arising out of same the Revised lists of proposed subscriptions as made out by the Secretary on the Rateable Valuation Basis adopted at last meeting were now submitted, as per copy attached. It was stated that the five Banks, (Bank of Ireland, Ulster, M.& L., National, and Provincial Banks) had now agreed to subscribe £50 each - and as they were listed under the heading £30 subscription it was ordered that they be transferred to the £50 list.

J.G.Boyd,Ltd., and Mr.William Holliday were assessed separately under the £30 list, and it was ordered that these two be coupled and transferred to the £50 list. As the total valuation of the Limerick Steam Co's premises amounted to £287, it was decided to list them under the £50 subscription list. Thus making 20 firms @ £50 each- £1000.-----£1000.

Seven Firms were therefore listed @ £30-----£210.

Fourteen Firms listed @ £15 ----- 210.

The National Land Bank was listed under £7.10. 0 sheet- it was reported they agreed to pay £10 subscription----- 10.

The following were transferred to the £7.10. 0 list:- Mr.St.Tubridy, Model Bakery; and Messrs.Kenny & Sons, Builders making a total on this list of 58 firms @ £7.10. 0 each----- 435.

The Secretary was asked to write a special letter to Messrs.Guinness & Sons with a view to getting a larger subscription than that which they were listed for.

There were 194 on the £2.10. 0 list----- 485.

Total £2,350.

---

With the above alterations the Committee adopted the list.

The Deputy-Mayor stated that General O'Duffy, Chief of Staff, General Headquarters, Beggars Bush, Dublin, was in Limerick on last Saturday and he had an interview with him regarding the maintenance of the Police Force. The General said he would be prepared to hand him a cheque for the amount of the weekly Pay Sheets provided the Force placed themselves under the authority of Dail Eireann. The Deputy Mayor said he could not agree to this condition as the Force was a purely civic one, and he pointed out to the General that his representative in Limerick (William St. Barracks) had guaranteed (the Force) them/the support of his troops at the Public Meeting of Traders which authorised the establishment of the Police Force. General O'Duffy now withdrew this guarantee, but stated the Police Force would not be interfered with. The Deputy Mayor further stated that before the interview terminated the General lead him to believe that a refund of the subscriptions raised locally may be expected when a definite decision as to the Government of the Country is come to.

The next business taken up by the Meeting was the appointment of a Collector to call on the various Firms etc assessed in the list, and in further lists to be compiled by the Secretary.

On the suggestion of Mr. O'Connell it was decided to ask Mr. John A. McNamara, late of Messrs. Wallis, a very capable man, to undertake the job at a commission of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ %. It was decided to give Mr. McNamara a supply of receipts and to ask him to take a list of those people who definitely refuse to subscribe.

The attached draft circular and notice of assessment was submitted and approved after a few alterations as marked. *See paper to be published*

A requisition from the Chief of Police for supply of half-dozen electric torches was granted.

The next meeting was fixed for Friday morning at 11 o'clock.

A Meeting of the Sub-Committee was held in the Chamber of Commerce at Four o'clock p.m. on Tuesday evening 23rd day of May, 1922.

There were present- His Worship, The Deputy-Mayor.

Messrs. M.D.Shaw, G.E.Goodbody, Geo.R.Ryan, Jos.A.O'Connell, and Dr. Fogerty.

With Mr.P.T.Conlan, Acting Secretary and Mr.J.A.McNamara, Collector.

The Minutes of Meeting held on the 19th May were read, confirmed, and signed as a correct record.

The Deputy-Mayor explained that in consultation with other members of the Committee he had decided to call this meeting specially to deal with the question of insuring the Police Force under the Workmen's Compensation Act or Employers Liability Assurance, and also the advisability of insuring against Third-Party Risk. He asked Mr. Shaw to give his views on the matter.

Before giving his opinion Mr.Shaw said that in view of the Agreement reached a few days ago between the two Irish Political Parties - The Republican and the Treaty Party - the question of the Government now maintaining the Force might again be taken up the proper quarter by the Deputy-Mayor. This Mr.O'Brien promised to look into. Mr.Shaw continuing - considered it would be very advisable to effect the two Insurances mentioned by the Chairman so as to indemnify the Committee against any accident to the members of the Force or to a third party by an act of the Police in the discharge of their duty. He mentioned for he had asked/quotations for such Policies. The matter was discussed and the unanimous opinion of the meeting was that the Insurances should be taken out. Arising hereout, however, the question of committing this sub-Committee to liability for ~~actions~~ irregular and unlawful of the Force, and the opinion of a previous meeting that the question of the legal employers of them should be left vague, was mooted.

On this point the Law Agent of the Corporation- Mr.J.J.Dundon- was called before the Committee for his opinion.

He considered, after a good deal of discussion that the Committee

might safely take out the Employers Liability Policy, as he did not think they would be committing themselves by doing so, but in regard to the Third Party Risk Policy, he pointed out that the Committee had no legal power behing them that could be conferred on the Force to legalise the use of Firearms - they had no power to shoot. He did not consider it prudent to take out the Third Party Policy, as it would be admitting liability. In reply a member of the Committee Mr.Dundon said he did not thing an Insurance Company would take the Corporation as the employers, as the Council had no ledal authority to establish the Force. It was unanimously decided to take out the Employers Liability Policy, and the Treasurers and Chairman were instructed to negotiate the matter. It was also decided to inquire regarding the terms and conditions of the Third Party Insurance.

The matter of payment of Unemployment and National Health Insurance was left stand for consideration at a future meeting.

The Deputy-Mayor undertook to arrange that the Police cases for the Courts would be dealt with by the Law Agent to the Corporation.

The Deputy-Mayor made a report re the Force taking up their Headquarterns in the Court House.

Mr.McNamara made a report on the condition of the Collection - he found it hard to get in some of the money. On the suggestion of Doctor Fogerty it was ordered that the method of assessment and particulars thereof be published in the Local Press. The matter of getting help for Mr.McNamara to collect was adjourned for a week.

A further list of Assessments containing 101 names of Traders etc in Rutland St. Patrick St.O'Connell St.Sarsfield St.Roches St. and Shannon St., was submitted as made out by the Secretary.





## Limerick City Police Force.

Dear Sir (or Madam),

The Sub-Committee, appointed by the Meeting of Merchants and Traders held at the Chamber of Commerce, on Friday, 5th May, to arrange for the maintenance of a Local Police Force, have held several Conferences since.

The new Body of Police, consisting of 38 men, have now taken up duty. Their Headquarters are situated in the City Court House. Any complaints or communications should be addressed to the Officer in charge, City Police Force.

As you are probably already aware this Force will have to be maintained as a purely Civic Body. The local Merchants, Traders, &c., are asked to subscribe the necessary funds for a period of about ten weeks. The Sub-Committee have carefully considered the question of the amounts of such subscriptions and have made assessments on the basis of Rateable Valuation.

It is hardly necessary for me to point out the urgent need for such a Force to protect the Citizens and their property, and I am sure you, in common with other Citizens and Firms, will be only too glad to forward your contribution at the earliest possible date to the Hon. Treasurers, named below, or hand same to the authorised collector, Mr. John A. McNamara, who will call on you in due course.


