# Limerick Corporation.

Petition against the proposal to leave Limerick un-represented on the Legislative Council, and asking that there should be two representatives in the Legislative Assembly for this Borough

To The Right Honourable and Honourable the Members of the House of Commons in Parliament assembled.

*The Petition of the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Limerick.*

HUMBLY SHEWETH:—

That a bill has been introduced into, and is now before a Committee of your Honourable House intituled "A Bill to amend the provision for the Government of Ireland."

That your petitioners find by the first Schedule annexed to said Bill, and dealing with the composition of the Legislative Council proposed to be elected thereunder that there shall not be any representative for the Borough of Limerick on said Legislative Council.

That your petitioners respectfully protest against such an omission as it would be a great injustice to this City and large district of which it is the centre, considering the extent of its trade, commerce, and population, the antiquity of its Municipality, and the commercial and agricultural importance possessed by Limerick. It is nearly seven hundred years since a charter was granted to Limerick in recognition of its various public claims and importance. Succeeding charters have enlarged its prerogatives. Parliaments have been held within its walls, and laws enacted applying to other parts of Ireland.

That from an early period of Ireland's representation in Parliament, Limerick elected two members to the House of Commons, and the Reform Act of 1832 re-affirmed that right. That your petitioners also consider Limerick should have two representatives in the Legislative Assembly.

That the reasons which have existed for the right of representation for Limerick, are much stronger now and should protect the City from the injustice with which it is threatened.

That the population is not only large as already stated, but likely to be augmented for many reasons: the decline of tillage in the Country and the increase of employment in the City by the springing up of Manufactories, &c.

That the importance of the port and harbour of Limerick is evidenced by the great increase in the tonnage arriving at our Quays. Twenty years since the tonnage was only 96,579 tons whilst it was in 1892 142,880, or an increase of nearly 50,000 tons.

This increasing prosperity is mainly due to the geographical position of Limerick which places her in the midst of the largest Railway System in Ireland, giving her communications with the fairs and markets of Clare, Tipperary, Kerry, Cork, Limerick, Waterford, Galway, Mayo, Roscommon, and Sligo. The Railway system now affords a direct communication from Limerick to the County of Sligo in the North-West, the entire of Clare to the extreme West, Kerry to South-West, and to the County Waterford to the East.

Within the Borough are held the four great Munster Fairs which attract immense numbers, and have enhanced her trading status and interests.

That Limerick is a great distributing centre, her enterprising merchants being now the first grain importers in Ireland, and the largest exporters by rail and river of provisions, cattle, cereals, fodder, and other products.

That not desiring in any degree to underrate the importance of agricultural interests we consider Trade and Commerce entitled to some more favour, considering the great numbers of the population dependent on them.

That a great draw back to the prosperity of the country is the absence of encouragement to manufactures. In former times it was by the Boroughs manufactures were fostered, and it is on the Cities and Towns now more than ever depends whether the revival of these industries shall be successful.

That in the proposed Legislative Council there are only five members out of the 48 allocated to the Boroughs of Ireland, thus inflicting a most grievous wrong on the Urban population of the country.

Your petitioners submit, therefore, that a City with the historic antecedents, the high commercial position, large population, and great importance of all its varied interests Limerick should be represented on the Legislative Council, and have two representatives in the Legislative Assembly, and so secure to its citizens, and the people of this vast district the inestimable advantage of having its interests protected and fostered in the future Legislature of Ireland.

And your Petitioners will ever pray.

 her Majesty's Government in whose desire to  
 promote the best interests of Ireland our people  
 have every confidence, we have peculiar  
 pleasure in recalling the fact that your family  
 have ever been the most ardent friends and  
 sincere well-wishers of our country.  
 "We are happy to know that your  
 Excellency will have an opportunity of  
 seeing at the Show to-day the capabilities of the  
 great and fertile agricultural district of which  
 our city is the capital, and which only requires  
 to be fostered by an Irish Legislature to equal in  
 prosperity any portion of her Majesty's dominions,  
 and we believe that in the future the trade  
 commerce and manufactures of Limerick, and of  
 the other cities and towns of Ireland, will be  
 stimulated and advanced by the watchful care of  
 a home government.  
 "We are aware that your Excellency does not  
 desire to refer to any political subject, but there  
 is one matter which is happily non-contentious,  
 and in which every section of our fellow-citizens  
 takes a deep interest—the representation of  
 Limerick in the future Legislature of Ireland.  
 We hope that in the proposed Legislative As-

sembly the city of Limerick will be represented  
 by two members, and that it shall be also repre-  
 sented in the Legislative Council.  
 "The Corporation and citizens of Limerick  
 avail of this occasion to represent to your  
 Excellency the unanimous desire of this com-  
 munity that mercy should be extended to the  
 remaining political prisoners, and that while ex-  
 pressing in the strongest manner their condem-  
 nation of all crime, they believe the time for  
 amnesty has come.  
 "We regret that your Excellency's present  
 brief visit does not allow us to exhibit more amply  
 those sentiments of respectful welcome which it  
 was the anxious desire of our Corporation to  
 manifest, but trust that another opportunity will  
 ere long be afforded us of making your Excel-  
 lency acquainted with our city, and the many  
 objects of interest it contains, and the beauties of  
 our noble river.  
 "This Corporation and the citizens of Limerick  
 now beg to express their best wishes for your  
 happiness in every position your Excellency may  
 occupy in this great empire.
