Namely - The overseeing of the sweeping & cleansing, & scavenging = watering the Streets = the removal and abatement of Nuisances = from the Streets, and from the interior, and back yards, of houses and other premises = and obstructions from the several Streets, Footways, and places within the City = the Sanitary State of the Borough in general, and the arrangement, and Management, of Hackney Carriages, plying for Hire &c. The powers conferred for carrying out these purposes, and objects, by the Limerick Improvement Act, together with the Acts of the 10th & 11th Vic Chk 34; and the 10th and 11th Vic Chk 89; - being both Comprehensive, and effective, if put into operation, this Committee therefore expect, and shall require, that Mr Clanchy will be vigilant, attentive, and assiduous in the discharge of the duties assigned to him, avoiding as few Complaints being made.

Sent - Gentlemen. According to your instructions
I must respectfully beg leave to submit the following report.
The number of men on this Establishment
is 22. herewith you will have a return of each man's book
the whole comprising in measurement, an extent of 900
Miles of Streets, Squares, public passages and of places,
under Watch and Ward.

I furnish, for your information, a return of the
Number of prisoners taken up by the Watch, prosecuted and
convicted for assaults, Robberies, Drunkenness, Rioting,
from June 1851. to April 1854. And also another
return of the number of prisoners taken up on a.c.c.
charged during the night - and brought into the
Watch House during the same period - The houses,
Warehouses, and Store property in this Parish, is
very much exposed, and at the mercy of the evil
disposed. And if it was not for the vigilance, and great
attention of every individual watchman on this last
Beats, there can be no doubt but that house breaking
plunders, and Robberies, would be of mighty dimensions.
The lives of many men, and women have been saved
by being taken up by the Watchmen, when found in a
deceitful state of intoxication, and who would have
most certainly perished, in that condition, only for
being brought to the Station, Cared for, (in some instances by
Mediced Gentlemen) and restored -
Robbers

Robberies and House breaking, or entering; have been frequent
by taking up the suspected, idle, and well known vicious
Characters of the City, when found prowling about the streets
at unreasonable hours of the night, and then discharged
them in the morning. The peace, quiet, and order of the
Parish is (all circumstances considered, / very fairly kept -
Public Peace, by preventing the Prostitution of the Town,
Many offensive & disgusting language whole passing along
the streets, is preserved, as much as is possible to effect. None of
that Class, who outrage common decency, or become disorderly
are immediately seized, and kept in the Watch house
until morning. Fires at Night - The Watchmen
with scarcely any exception, are the first to give the alarm
of fire occurring in Houses or stores, to bring the Engine to
the spot, and work it, and in very many cases, they
suppress the commencement of a fire, and prevent its
further progress.

Taking into consideration the extent and
importance of this Parish, to which is now added, a considerable
and inhabited District of the Borough, Saint Michaels
not hitherto under the management of any governing
Body, the preservation of the immense amount of property
together with the peace and order to be preserved in public
Streets by 22 Men, is of vital importance. I am of opinion,
and humbly take leave to state, that it would be
dangerous, imprudent, and injudicious to reduce
the number of the Night Watch in this Parish, thereby
rendering the Establishment totally inefficient.
