Read Mr. Mitchell's statement as follows viz. The Treasurer's salary was £200 a year for transacting the business of the Corporation the Improvement Act provides that the Treasurer shall do in addition to the duties of Corporation Treasurer the following -

- The formation of Rates
- " Rate Books.
- " Warrants

And all the Management of the Receipts and Disbursements of the Improvement Rate - also of the General purposes Rates, and for both Rates

Seven Warrants containing 28000 names descriptions of Property Valuation and Calculation from each, must this year (1855) be prepared -

The Treasurer had to transact all the business formerly done by the former Sur. Treasurer - He has also to make out the lists of Sur. and to pay all rates expenses - To provide weekly abstract of Pay Sheet - and to pay every Friday over 150 pounds.

The above various additional duties have been placed on the Treasurer by the Improvement Act - And that Act it is to be supposed never could have contemplated doing such an unjust and oppressive thing to the Treasurer to do such an amount of labour without commensurate emolument -

It was proposed by Alderman Emilian seconded by Alderman Soynt.

That a sum of a £100 appear be paid to the Treasurer to enable him to employ an Assistant -

(Copy Report.)

In pursuance of the Resolution passed at the last meeting of the Council - Your Committee have had under consideration the Applications of your Collectors and Treasurers for an increase of their respective Salaries -

Mr Hunt attended before your Committee and gave in the Statement or Return which accompanies this Report - from which it appears that prior to his Appointment as an Officer of the Corporation, the Annual Cops Collected by him was received from Wealthy and independent Rate payers, scarcely exceeding 3,000 in number, Whereas he is now required to collect the various Rates of the Borough at different periods of the year from over 7,000 persons many of whom are in a State of great Poverty and want - and under 4 distinct warrants containing 28,000 Names, thereby increasing his labor eight fold, while the Amount of his Salary is unchanged -

Mr Hunt further states that in order to ensure the due Collection of these Rates, he had to devote to the object a Majority of his office Staff - and he calculates his outlay at a sum exceeding the entire Salary received by him from the Corporation -

He stated in addition that at the time he entered into the agreement or understanding hereinafter referred to - Sir John Young's Bill, had not become Law, and under the provisions of which the smallest Tenements in the City, and those almost poorer Occupants, are now taxed - and from whom the enforcement of the Rates is attendant with the greatest possible difficulty

Your Committee have taken into their best Consideration the Claim thus urged, and so referred to them - and while fully recognizing the Equitable grounds upon which Mr Hunt has rested his Application for an Augmentation of Salary - the increased and undervalued Duties that have devolved upon him - and the very efficient and laborious manner in which those Duties have been discharged - they nevertheless feel that, having regard to the Nature of the Contract he entered into - on occasion of his Appointment - and also all taking into account the financial Difficulties of the Corporation and the enormous Weight of Taxation that so heavily presses upon the Rate payers of the City - they cannot condescend with those duty they owe to their fellow Citizens - to present any increase of Salary to that very useful and Valuable Officer -

Mr Francis John O'Neill, also

attended before your Committee, and brought under their Notice the vastly increased Amount of Labour that had been cast upon him by the recent Acts of Parliament - and he submitted to them the accompanying Statement of the New Duties he had to perform, and to which they invite the Particular Attention of the Council -

From the Representations made, and the evidence laid before your Committee they feel bound to state that no Officer can bring to the Discharge of his various Duties - greater Zeal, and Ability than your present Treasurer - They are moreover, satisfied that the energies of this excellent Public Officer are at present overtaxed, and that his Case is one which justly entitles him at the

hands of the Corporation to the most considerable attention

A proposition was made to your Committee for increasing his salary to the extent of £100 a year - but an amendment was finally adopted upon a very able division recommending a new law of such increase of salary that a proper and efficient Assistant should be provided for Mr. Mill, by the Corporation, and thereby lighten the duties, and lessen the harassing labors that had devolved upon him under the provisions of the recent acts of Parliament. And your Committee accordingly recommended to the Council the confirmation of the foregoing suggestions.
