it for a considerable time. Great care should be taken to thoroughly incorporate this chemical compound with the blood; I noticed that the blood in one of the Casks had a stronger odour than it should have had it been well mixed with the disinfectant. The blood at the Dublin Corporation Abattoir is treated with this chemical substance and is thereby rendered perfectly inodorous.

The blood is discharged from the casks into an iron tank 14 feet long 6 feet wide and 2 feet deep. From this receptacle which is situated in the open air the blood is pumped up into one or other of two smaller iron tanks placed in the loft of a large building. From these tanks the blood is next passed into the desiccator or drying apparatus, which consists of an iron wheel in which there is a revolving axle provided with three blades to keep the blood in motion whilst being dried. The heat is supplied by means of a steam-jacket. Nine-tenths of blood consist of water which fluid is distilled from the solid contents of the blood. The distillate ascends through a tower in which it comes in

contact with a copious spray of water by which it is condensed and finally it flows out from the tower into the open air and is ultimately discharged into a sewer. Some gaseous matter collects in the tower and to prevent it from becoming a nuisance, it is brought into contact with a spray of solution of permanganate of potassium (Condy's liquid) a very powerful deodorizer. The permanganate having washed the air falls into a small vessel from which it is passed up to the tower to be again used and this process goes on until the flowers of the permanganate is expended which is known to be the case by its red colour vanishing.

When the blood is dried it is transferred to bags and stored in a large building.

I understand that the air from the desiccator was formerly allowed to pass into the atmosphere it is now conveyed together with the distilled water from the blood into the sewer. The arrangements for desiccating the blood seem to be perfect and the precautions adopted to prevent the escape of unpleasantly odorous vapours from the distilling apparatus are very good.



I have, however to point out defects in the whole process which must be remedied in order to prevent the works from being a nuisance to the neighbourhood.

The external tank for the blood and the pump should be removed as the exposure of the blood to the atmosphere is undesirable and as there is a decidedly unpleasant odour caused during the pumping of the blood. The casks of blood should be elevated into the loft and their contents either directly discharged into the desiccator, or if the measuring tanks already referred to must be used, then they should be completely covered in and the blood passed into them through a hopper or funnel provided with a screw cover. The condensed water from the desiccator and the perspiration exposed to the air as they are now. The waste steam reaches the air of the works where it liable to contamination, it should therefore be discharged into the chimney of the works and sent up to a high part of the atmosphere.

If the above suggestions

be fully acted upon and if the blood be carefully mixed with the deodorant I am of opinion that the process of blood drying at Limerick might be conducted so as to produce no nuisance or a very trifling one."

they should be. Amongst some that I have noticed, is Stokes lane which appears to be very rarely swept or if otherwise heaps of filth very quickly accumulate there again. There is a small yard with a shed in it just at the opening into this lane, kept by a man named Barry where cattle are kept in the winter and a donkey and pigs during the summer. There is a constant nuisance from this shed and yard into the lane and it is very offensive and dangerous to the poor people living in the lane and having to pass in and out - I have reported on this place before. It is no longer placé to keep cattle of any kind and if to be allowed to keep them these houses be made take care no nuisance would be caused by them.

I have also to call attention to the large accumulations of manure and other offensive matters allowed to remain for a very considerable time in some of the lanes, notably those lanes off Bathorne St. between Glastowth St. and Cecil St. and the lane leading from Queen St. into Little Glastowth Street.
