DR BARRY REPORTS TO THE MEDICAL INSPECTOR.

INTERESTING REPORT.
 At Wednesday night's meeting of the Public Health Committee, the following communication was received from Dr. Barry, Medical Officer of Health:

"14, Lower Malabar-st., 6th April, 1900.
 To the Right Worshipful Mayor and Corporation of Limerick.
 In compliance with your request to explain the circumstances concerning the paragraph in Dr. Brown's report that I do not appear to have been consulted in the first place, to state that this paragraph in Dr. Brown's report was initiated by me. I felt that the sanitary conditions of the city were not in any way improved on arrangements.

Dr. Brown called on me recently to give him statistics of the births, the death rate, and other details concerning the city. In addition to the size there was no source whatsoever through which I had obtained any information on this matter. I asked Dr. Brown to specify inform the name of the person who had initiated the report of Health without defined duties, assistants, and without one farthing of salary.

"In the year 1874 the Sanitary Act was passed, which provided for the appointment of a medical officer of health for his district, and each Local Authority appointed a consulting sanitary officer, whose duties were confined solely to consulting and advising, just as was in the parent that the Public Health Act of that year was passed, and its provisions carried out. Amongst its provisions was that of the appointment of a medical superintendent.

IN THE MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT MEDICAL OFFICERS OF HEALTH in the four child cities of Ireland, whose duties should be of a practical character, and who were appointed by the Local Authorities, and who were assisted by him in the execution of his duties. The duties of the sanitary sub-officers by which infectious diseases would be fought, and disinfection, purification and other necessary means of the disease. All this should be supervised, and if necessary participated, by the superintendent medical officer of health. I consider a form which will give an idea of the 1878 and four medical superintendents were appointed, £200 a year was given to Dublin, £250 a year to Cork, and £100 a year to Limerick.

Now on this was, in my opinion, that I happened to be appointed before I had my salary fixed. When first appointed in expectation of my salary—I paid £25 out of my pocket for the printing for the year, and for forms of weekly reports of the medical officers, etc.; but my disappointment was very great when no salary whatever my resignation, after I had accepted an onerous position with responsible duties and without any remuneration whatever.

My resignation would not be accepted for two years. I frequently performed duties when any of our Mayor requested me to do so. Finally, I would simply request of you that you should appoint a person to take the position of the Superintendent Medical Officer of Health, or also from the position, it will be necessary to be paid. I appoint an officer recommended to your worship (the Mayor) and to your Council the necessity of having some such officer who would be superior to the duties of all the duties which the provisions of the Public Health Act demand.—I am, Mr. Mayor and Gentlemen, your obedient servant, R. W. J. DALY, M.D., F.R.C.S.I., ROYAL BARRISTERS, R.U.I."

 - (5.) Wakes, or permits to be waked, in any house, room, or place,
 over which he has control, the body of any person who has
 died of any dangerous infectious disorder,

shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds; and a person

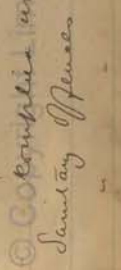

I inspected the Park district with Dr. Mulcahy
on the 18th inst. In some cases we found a cess-pool
in front and very near the dwelling house attached to
which there is in every case a shed used during the
summer months for pigs, and in the winter months as a
cow shed. In one or two yards there was a stagnant
pool, the refuse of those sheds, which drainage has no
means whatever of escape, except by evaporation. This
is not sufficient. The natural inclination on both
sides of this district makes it very easy to do away
with any surface water such as we found there, and a
proper channel for this purpose should be at once
provided: until this is done the people cannot have
the houses and yards in anything like a sanitary
state. I consider it useless to attempt any active
measures in the area whilst the channel is in this
condition, and believe if the necessary repairs were
executed it would be easy to get the inhabitants to
remove the dry refuse sufficiently far from their
premises as to secure favourable hygienic conditions
in this very important vegetable centre. I strongly
recommend the immediate construction of this channel.

GENTLEMEN/

I beg to report that there are six cases of Typhoid and three cases of Typhus notified since the 17th. Two patients suffering from Typhoid died. In both cases the patients gave a history of being ill for the greater part of the month without seeing a Doctor, and were in consequence in such an exhausted state when admitted to Hospital that their lives could not be prolonged. Removal to Hospital was in each case carried out & also disinfection of the clothes and rooms. In almost every case of fresh Typhoid the patients came from parts of the City in which the disease was from the beginning of this outbreak and that the germs were in those cases air borne is, I believe, evident; I have gone into each carefully and can trace without a hitch how contamination was possible. I am unable to couple either milk or water as the means of communication in any of them.

The Typhus cases happily are not numerous & up to the present none of them have ended fatally. Of course occurring at the same time and in portions of the City so widely separated where means of communication were out of the question makes the cause which I gave in my last report the certain one.

I wish to direct your particular attention to the terrible danger of the night soil and point out to you that no matter what the original channel of communication was the disease is certain to last if this deplorable practice is not put a stop to and for this reason I must ask that the Bye-Law relating to this nuisance be put in force and carried out with determination, otherwise we are only nourishing instead of putting an end to this outbreak.

In several of the houses from which the enteric cases came the sanitary arrangements were in a wretched condition: two particularly bad, no water closets at all.

those are situated in our principal streets. One, which is a corner house in a leading thoroughfare, had one of the arches of its area turned into a privy, and this seemed to be going on for a long time, quite close to which is laid on the water for domestic purposes. In this area I found an untrapped drain communicating with the sewer in the street, and from what I could gather it was the custom to throw the house-refuse towards this drain and depend on the willingness of the servant to throw water over the yard to flush it. It is evident that there was free access of sewer gas into the under portion of this house, and also to the street above, which in my opinion was enough to poison not alone the poor girl who has died but every one who passed the place while it was in this filthy condition. I have directed the Sanitary Sub-Offices to see that a proper trap & sanitary accommodation be provided without delay.

In another house in Upper William Street which has come to my notice, and from which a patient has gone to St. John's Hospital with enteric a similar defect exists. At the rear of this house is a yard common to three houses & into which every one has access. The only sanitary accommodation is a cess-pit for each house, & which is dependent on the Corporation to be cleaned away say once a week. I have given the necessary instructions that proper accommodation be provided for each house, & entirely do away with the cess-pits.

GENTLEMEN,

I beg to report that ^{one} case of typhoid fever has been reported to me since the 23rd September. This case was reported on October the 9th-one of the pupils of the New Training College, Mount Prospect, Limerick. She was promptly removed to St John's Hospital and the Visiting Physician to the College has certified to me that the necessary disinfecting precautions were carried out.

According to the instructions of the Committee at their last meeting I inspected Dispensary District No 3 for the purpose of recommending a proper means for the disposal of night soil in the Streets and Lanes of this District. District No 3 is one of the largest in the City, and in order that efficient accommodation be provided for the disposal of night soil in suitable pails a large number will be required. I should suggest that at first only a limited area of the district say Nelson Street and the lanes off it be experimented upon, as it is only by degrees that the people in the several districts can be taught to use those pails with advantage so that by confining your attention to this limited quarter over which the necessary supervision can be so easily placed the people can be shown what is required of them and from what I could gather when going amongst them I am sure in a few weeks they will gladly give any assistance necessary for the satisfactory working out of this system which can then be extended over the district.

Taking the lanes off Nelson Street they number in all ten-5 on each side, those on the left hand side of it as you approach the Railway are thickly populated and will require at least 2 pails, for four of them of the dimensions say 30 inches by 24 by 24 one to be placed at the blind end of the lane and the other at the corner of each lane and Nelson Street. One of the lanes on this side known as "O'Gormans" is not so congested, I believe one pail will be sufficient for this, the lane has no flushing apparatus and I wish to draw particular attention to this defect.

The pails best suited for this purpose are the usual galvanised iron ones with a closely fitting hinged lid on each. The lanes on the opposite side and which open into Dominick

Street are very long ones and will require four pails of the same dimensions as the ones I have already given: it is very much to be regretted that the Nelson Street opening of Hunt's Lane is so narrow although the cause of the obstruction is an old ruin which should be done away with by so doing the ventilation and lighting of this lane would be vastly improved and what is as equally important the allowing of sufficient accommodation for the passage through of a horse and cart.

Myles' Lane on this side is rather small and a pail at either end will be sufficient.

In the Queen Street district there is one pail required for Little Glentworth Street, one for Ryan's Lane, and another for Pump Lane, one for Duggan's Court, three for Back Queen Street, and one for Little Queen Street.

BOHERBUOY—Dickson's Lane will want four pails, Henry Place will require two, Barry's which is too narrow to allow a horse and cart through will want to have a pail placed at either end of it. Piggott's Lane requires two pails, and King's Lane which is also an arrow one will require a pail at either end.

EDWARD STREET—Ball-Alley Lane will want one pail, Ball-Alley Place two, Lower Browne's Lane two, Hall's Lane two.

Upper Browne's Lane which is a most important one on account of its population is at present in a very unsanitary state. In the wall at its supposed blind end is a passage through into a large area of waste ground at the back, this waste space is in a most filthy condition from manure heaps and cess-pools of long standing and accumulations of all sorts of rubbish in fact it is made the receptacle for the night soil and other faecal accumulations from this end of the lane. I must ask that special attention be at once paid to this, have the hole in the wall closed, and those accumulations of filth removed as the whole place is at present most dangerous to the health of the people in its immediate neighbourhood. There are two pails wanted for this lane.

Stokes' Lane two pails, Barrack lane-off Edward Street, and Duggan's Lane-off Collooney Street require one pail.

Walsh's Lane will want three pails, Keefe's Lane one, Madden's

King's Lane-off this Road- requires a pail, Young's ditto Richardson's which is very narrow and angular will require a pail to be palced at either end of it, Sparling's Lane one pail, Anderson's Court two, Pump Lane three, Punched Lane three, Lee's Lane three, Walsh's two, and Glover's two.

VIZES' FIELDS The lanes off this place are in a very unsanitary state and will require at least six pails, Little Barrington Street requires a pail at each end of it, and Schoolhouse Lane requires three. Taylor's Street and Griffith's Row require three pails.

I have nothing further to add except to say that this "Pail System" of night soil removal is urgently needed, and will prove of the utmost advantage to the public health of the City.

GARRISTON: I beg to report that an epidemic of measles of a severe type and very high mortality is prevalent in the city, especially in the poor quarters. The high death-rate is due to complications brought on by exposure as well as to want of proper accommodation and nursing. In several of the large institutions in Lanes, where a large number of children are kept, the disease found its way; the death-rate in those places was scarcely noticable, especially where the proper accommodation and nursing are favourable to disease. Measles is not one of the notifiable diseases and is readily thought very light about by people generally; still, anyone seeing what a high death-rate it causes in a week or so should be careful to check their opinions, and pay as much attention to its treatment as if it were attached by the same mode of infection as diphtheria. Some of the means to be adopted to avert its progress are, first, that every child brought under the Medical Officer's notice where proper isolation cannot be carried out, should be compelled to go to hospital, have the house disinfectant and have any other children in the house prevented from attending school. In this way a good deal would be done to prevent it spreading, and what is more important is the assurance that the necessary attention with suitable isolation will, in a great measure, help to lessen this high death-rate. Up to the very few children who are sent to hospital with measles, the epidemic appears to be entirely local for the best month, that something might be done to try and save it to a lives of the children under five years of age. I regret to have to report an outbreak of typhus fever during the week, in all four cases, three of which broke out in the same family in Palace Road, in the Lanes, District. The other occurred in Rill Alley. The patient is now recovering. I am, Sir, in the opinion I found the other occupants in a most deplorable state of poverty and dirt, and under an order to have the whole family, consisting of a woman and six children, transferred to an isolation ward of the District Infirmary, and this morning one of these children is reported to be suffering from typhus. Bell Alley, Lanes

is certainly in a most unhealthy state, and had it not been for the rain during the year. So that these responsible men without delay carry out any necessary sanitary arrangements, line washing and repairs in every house, or else I must ask for complete closure of the gas led and of disease. I wish to say that the Sanitary Officer connected with these institutions in City Council, for which I commend them very highly. I learned from them with much delight that the Corporation is allowing them to attend the Hygienic Classes at the Technical School, which I consider a most necessary and important step. The only reason why the number of sanitary sub-officers is so limited to three, or any of them may get knocked out from hard work and late hours during a severe outbreak, that two other auxiliaries, who should also attend the Hygienic Classes, be appointed. Another matter I wish to refer to before your committee is the question of the water supply for the river. I have mentioned to you the bacteriological examination by Sir Adam McCollough, and which was handed in as evidence at the investigation held on Mr. Franks, a patient who suffered from typhoid during the last epidemic. The samples were taken from the Gosody River, the Shannon at the bridge, Garwoken, and Sweeney. The samples taken were collected by Voltaire McWashy, and the water at the cause of the epidemic might be obliterated. His reports finding the bacteria in two of the samples - one from Newcastles, and the other from the Shannon at Bishops. The presence of the bacillus in the pollution was found in the Shannon at the Mill. This pollution is caused by the Castle comm. sewerage, the filter beds at Charwell not working properly, for if they were in the best condition, it could not find their way to the reservoir. I should suggest that a fresh examination of the water at Charwell should be made by Mr. W. Stosh. I am, Sir, in the opinion I will endeavour to submit with proper care samples from each filter bed for solvent examination. I am, Sir, gentlemen, your obedient servant, M. S. M. Dr. J. McWeney, M.A., reported on two samples of water submitted for analysis by Mr. Marcell, Superintendent Medical Officer at Mungret. The samples were taken from the same well, which is used for drinking purposes, and chemical characters were as follows: The sample marked B contains bacillus coli communis in as little as two cubic centimetres, in question being one of the samples submitted to sewage contamination. The amount, however, must be slight in amount, as the chlorides are low (1.1 per cent). The microscopic examination of the sediment failed to reveal anything suspicious. The Surveyor explained that sample B was taken from the water tank in the room outside, Clareville, food-stalls. The sample was filtered water taken from the water tank. The results (Experiment Medical Officer) of the analysis are as follows: The nature has been reported to me since your last committee meeting, and that those cases already reported are concerning As Water Works, and Clackshole, between Watergate and Jones's lane, leading to Mungret-Street. Some of the houses in this lane are surrounded and contain as many as four heavy sanitary accommodations, although at the ones at the Watergate end there are back-paths which would be very suitable for sanitary purposes. The whole place is rapidly becoming a slum, and in the houses are broken, half-fitting doors and windows; every house in the lane requires whitewashing, and the roadway of this lane is full of holes which retain the water, and are a nuisance to the public. There are two houses in particular of this kind, the fronts of which are in Mungret Street. These are in such a wretched state of dilapidation that they are positively dangerous to the public. The owner of the first lot to be repaired, and having them rebuilt will need the same. According to a return made out for me after careful inspection by sanitary officers of the district, the following particulars I find that there are no less than 231 pits in this particular locality, 369 of them having been drawn to it. It was supposed to know in what condition the yards were kept, and to inform on that subject, every yard. In any city now in which any attention is paid to sanitary improvements there are very great restrictions on persons who keep pigs, and even that the yards are kept clean and free from refuse. The pig and manure exist to such an extent there is at very least a strong caution required, or also more effective measures will have to be adopted. I wish to submit to you a report on the subject, and also two samples of water which I forwarded to the Sanitary Sub-Committee. You will remember that Prof. McWeney, on a former occasion, discovered that bacillus coli communis was in the water from New-Street, and that the water from the water-works in the same locality was also contaminated. I thought it right to submit these samples for further analysis. One of my samples was taken from the water tank in this case. Dr. McWeney has again found bacillus coli communis, showing distinctly bacillus coli communis. I am glad to say that the water in the water tank at the water-works is free from bacillus coli communis, and that we are altogether at the mercy of the possible fact that the filter beds will not get out of order. I reported to you the results of the analysis of the water from the water tank at Clareville, although this should have been sent with Mr. Priddy to the Sanitary Sub-Committee.
