TO ALL VOLUNTEERS OF THE DUBLIN BRIGADE.

The Commandant General, referring to a recent incident in which three Volunteers found themselves confronted by a large body of soldiery, reminds all Commanders of Units of the danger of small parties becoming isolated, and reminds all men to keep in touch with the Unit—squad, section or company—to which they are attached.

He furthermore points out that the danger to which he refers would largely disappear if all Volunteers made it a point to attend **ALL** parades whenever ordered.

He therefore orders all officers and men to attend **ALL** Battalion Parades without exception whenever called. Excuses for non-attendance should be sent beforehand and (where possible) in writing.

Where a sudden Battalion mobilisation is ordered absentees will be automatically suspended pending consideration of their excuses by their Company Commanders or, in the case of officers, by the O/C the Battalion. The same rule will apply to **all** Brigade mobilisations, whether sudden or announced beforehand.
