KILLED AT ANNACARTY

MR. JOHN WALL, CO. C., BRUFF

The man shot dead at Annacarty, Cappawhite, on Fri. has been identified as Sean de Bhall (Mr. John Wall), chairman Limerick Co. Council, who was a farmer and builder at Bruff. The body had lain at the military barracks, Tipperary, since the ambush, the official report of which declared that "one unknown ambusher was killed by the R.I.C. fire."

Mr. Wall, who was aged 32 and a man of powerful physique, was brother of Rev. T. Wall, C.C., Drumcollogher, vice-pres. of the Gaelic League.

Arrangements had been made to inter the remains yesterday in St. John's cemetery, Tipperary, where a grave had been dug, but during the afternoon relatives of the deceased claimed the remains, which were taken to St. Michael's church, whence they will be conveyed to Limerick to-day.
