I have again been in contact with the Limerick Health Authority regarding the 9% National increase. The following is an extract from their reply.

"Under the scheme of Conciliation and Arbitration revised rates of remuneration have been recommended for certain grades of nursing staff and enclose details of same. The increase involved is greater than 9% and the revised rates are subject to the sanction of the Minister of Health. I will be applying for such sanctions within the next few days."
