

And by S. 5 the same powers are vested in the Mayor and two of the Aldermen of all Counties of Cities and Counties of Towns so far as relates to Streets &c within the walls of their respective Towns or Cities.

Chapter 32

The inhabitants of the City of Limerick cannot be prevailed upon to present money sufficient for the repair of the streets which are in a very bad state. The magistrates are willing to put the former act in Execution but are apprehensive that the latter amounts to a virtual repeal of it.
