To Captain Wilkinson of the Prince of Wales's Reg^t of Light Dragoons - Clonmell.

The Memorial of Darby Nowland late of Brinckly in the Parish of Ayle and County of Limerick

Humbly shewetho That your Memorialist in the Months of February and March last, was aiding and assisting, a Troop of the Prince of Wales's Light Dragoons in apprehending the Murderers of Mary Dwyer and of Edwards and Winifred his wife, and Darby Dwyer & her two sons - and & her two Grand sons, (William and George Dwyer) - who were his nearest relatives - and that after repeated attempts, succeeded in bringing to Conviction and Death - Denis Carroll and William Ryan of the said Parish - deeply concerned in the above Murder - and who were Executed at Tipperary upon this Evidence given at a Gen^l Court Martial, there assembled - whereof you were President,

Your Memorialist in consequence of Advertisements of the Nobility, Clergy, and Gentry of the Counties of Tipperary and Limerick appearing in the Public papers, that a Reward of Fifty pounds, should be given to the Person or Persons apprehending, or bringing to Justice each of the perpetrators of the aforesaid Murders, and your Memorialist not having received any part of the Reward offer'd; - Submits the Case to your Recommendation, and has further to state that in consequence of his Apprehending and bringing to Justice, the above named people, he was - Compell'd to leave his native home, and seek protection by enlisting as a Private Soldier in the above Regiment, which is also humbly submitted to your Consideration.

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I do hereby Certify that the annexed Memorial of Darby Nowland is perfectly true and that on a General Court Martial held at Tipperary on the 27th day of March last by order of Lieut. General Lake at which I had the honour to preside, the Memorialist did give such clear unequivocal Evidence against Denis Carroll & Will^m Ryan tried for the Murder of the persons within (mentioned as Brought them to Conviction and Death. And I further Certify that in consequence of repeated threats of Revenge against the Memorialist, he was obliged to fly from his native place and become a private Soldier in the Princess of Wales's Regt. of Light Dragoons.
