

population of Pacific Pocket Mice (Perognathus longimembris pacificus) in

a remote location in the hills of Laguna Beach. The mice had been believed to be extinct in the 1980's, until a small population was rediscovered in 1993. The San Diego Zoo Institute for Conservation Research has since been working on a captive breeding program in partnership with OC Parks and USFW and are re-introducing them into the wild with the help of a bespoke Animex fencing solution. One month after the release, the mice were adapting well to their new habitat and showing signs of reproductive readiness.
